Part IV of chapter 489, Florida Statutes, 25 consisting of sections 489.661, 489.662, 489.663, 489.664, 489.665, 489.666, 489.667, and 489.668, is created to read: 26 27 PART IV 2.8 PORTABLE RESTROOM CONTRACTING 29 489.661 Definitions.--As used in this part, the term: 30 "Department" means the Department of Health.

whose services are unlimited in the portable restroom trade who has had at least 3 years' experience as a Florida-registered portable restroom contractor; who has knowledge of state health code law and rules; and who has the experience, knowledge, and skills to handle, deliver, and pick up sanitary portable restrooms, to install, safely handle, and maintain portable holding tanks, and to handle, transport, and dispose of domestic portable restroom and portable holding tank wastewater.

489.662 Registration required.--A person may not hold himself or herself out as a portable restroom contractor in this state unless he or she is registered by the department in accordance with this part. However, this part does not prohibit any person licensed pursuant to s. 489.105(3)(m) or ss. 489.551-489.558 from engaging in the profession for which he or she is licensed.

489.663 Administration of part; registration qualifications; examination.--

- (1) Each person desiring to be registered pursuant to this part shall apply to the department in writing upon forms prepared and furnished by the department.
- (2) The department shall administer, coordinate, and enforce the provisions of this part, provide qualifications for applicants, administer the examination for applicants, and be responsible for the granting of certificates of registration to qualified persons.
- 28 (3) The department shall adopt reasonable rules
 29 pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer this part,
 30 including, but not limited to, rules that establish ethical
 31 standards of practice, requirements for registering as a

contractor, requirements for obtaining an initial or renewal certificate of registration, disciplinary guidelines, and requirements for the certification of partnerships and corporations. The department may amend or repeal the rules in accordance with chapter 120.

- (4) To be eligible for registration by the department as a portable restroom contractor, the applicant shall:
- (a) Be of good moral character. In considering good moral character, the department may consider any matter that has a substantial connection between the good moral character of the applicant and the professional responsibilities of a registered contractor, including, but not limited to, the applicant being convicted or found guilty of, or entering a plea of nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a crime in any jurisdiction that directly relates to the practice of contracting or the ability to practice contracting and previous disciplinary action involving portable restroom contracting for which all judicial reviews have been completed.
- (b) Pass an examination approved by the department which demonstrates that the applicant has a fundamental knowledge of the state laws relating to the installation, maintenance, and wastewater disposal of portable restrooms, portable sinks, and portable holding tanks.
 - (c) Be at least 18 years of age.
- (d) Have a total of at least 3 years of active experience serving an apprenticeship as a skilled worker under the supervision and control of a registered portable restroom contractor. Related work experience or educational experience may be substituted for no more than 2 years of active contracting experience. Each 30 hours of coursework approved

1 by the department shall be substituted for 6 months of work experience. Out-of-state work experience shall be accepted on 2 3 a year-for-year basis for any applicant who demonstrates that he or she holds a current license issued by another state for 4 5 portable restroom contracting which was issued upon 6 satisfactory completion of an examination and continuing 7 education courses that are equivalent to the requirements in 8 this state. Individuals from a state with no state 9 certification who have successfully completed a written examination provided by the Portable Sanitation Association 10 11 International shall only be required to take the written portion of the examination that includes state health code law 12 and rules. For purposes of this section, an equivalent 13 examination must include the topics of state health code law 14 and rules applicable to portable restrooms and the knowledge 15 required to handle, deliver, and pick up sanitary portable 16 restrooms; to install, handle, and maintain portable holding 17 tanks; and to handle, transport, and dispose of domestic 18 19 portable restroom and portable holding tank wastewater. A person employed by and under the supervision of a licensed 20 contractor shall be granted up to 2 years of related work 21 22 experience. 23

- (e) Have not had a registration revoked the effective date of which was less than 5 years before the application.
- (5) The department shall provide each applicant for registration pursuant to this part with a copy of this part and any rules adopted under this part. The department may also prepare and disseminate such other material and questionnaires as it deems necessary to effectuate the registration provisions of this part.

(6) Any person who was employed one or more years in this state by a portable restroom service holding a permit issued by the department on or before October 1, 2003, has until October 1, 2004, to be registered by the department in accordance with this part and may continue to perform portable restroom contracting services until that time. Such persons are exempt until October 1, 2004, from the 3 years' active work experience requirement of s. 489.663(4)(d).

489.664 Registration renewal.--The department shall prescribe by rule the method for approval of continuing education courses and for renewal of annual registration. At a minimum, annual renewal shall include continuing education requirements of not less than 6 classroom hours annually for portable restroom contractors.

489.665 Certification of partnerships and corporations.--

(1) The practice of or the offer to practice portable restroom contracting services by registrants through a parent corporation, corporation, subsidiary of a corporation, or partnership offering portable restroom contracting services to the public through registrants under this chapter as agents, employers, officers, or partners is permitted if one or more of the principal officers of the corporation or one or more partners of the partnership and all personnel of the corporation or partnership who act on its behalf as portable restroom contractors in this state are registered as provided by this part and if the corporation or partnership has been issued a certificate of authorization by the department as provided in this section. A registered contractor may not be the sole qualifying contractor for more than one business that requests a certificate of authorization. A business

organization that loses its qualifying contractor has 60 days following the date the qualifier terminates his or her 2 3 affiliation within which to obtain another qualifying contractor. During this period, the business organization may 4 5 complete any existing contract or continuing contract, but may 6 not undertake any new contract. This period may be extended once by the department for an additional 60 days upon a 7 8 showing of good cause. This section may not be construed to 9 mean that a certificate of registration to practice portable 10 restroom contracting must be held by a corporation. A 11 corporation or partnership is not relieved of responsibility for the conduct or acts of its agents, employees, or officers 12 by reason of its compliance with this section, and an 13 individual practicing portable restroom contracting is not 14 relieved of responsibility for professional services performed 15 by reason of his or her employment or relationship with a 16 17 corporation or partnership.

- (2) For the purposes of this section, a certificate of authorization shall be required for a corporation, a partnership, an association, or a person practicing under a fictitious name when offering portable restroom contracting services to the public, except that when an individual is practicing portable restroom contracting in his or her own given name, he or she is not required to register under this section.
- (3) Each certification of authorization shall be renewed every 2 years. Each partnership and corporation certified under this section shall notify the department within 1 month after any change in the information contained in the application upon which the certification is based.

1	(4) Disciplinary action against a corporation or
2	partnership shall be administered in the same manner and on
3	the same grounds as disciplinary action against a registered

5	(5) When a certificate of authorization has been
6	revoked, any person authorized by law to provide portable
7	restroom contracting services may not use the name or
8	fictitious name of the entity whose certificate was revoked,
9	or any other identifiers for the entity, including telephone
10	numbers, advertisements, or logos.
11	489.666 Suspension or revocation of registrationA
12	certificate of registration may be suspended or revoked upon a
13	showing that the registrant has:
14	(1) Violated any provision of this part.
15	(2) Violated any lawful order or rule rendered or
16	adopted by the department.
17	(3) Obtained his or her registration or any other
18	order, ruling, or authorization by means of fraud,
19	misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts.
20	(4) Been found guilty of gross misconduct in the
21	pursuit of his or her profession.
22	489.667 Fees; establishment
23	(1) The department shall, by rule, establish fees as
24	follows:
25	(a) For registration as a portable restroom

27	1. Application and examination fee: not less than \$25
28	nor more than \$75.

9	489.668 Penalties and prohibitions
10	(1) Any person who violates any provision of this part
11	commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as
12	provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
13	(2) The department may deny a registration if it
14	determines that an applicant does not meet all requirements of
15	this part or has violated any provision of this part. Any
16	applicant aggrieved by such denial is entitled to a hearing,
17	after reasonable notice thereof, upon filing a written request
18	for such hearing in accordance with chapter 120.

Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2003. SENATE SUMMARY Creates part IV of chapter 489, F.S., to require the registration of portable restroom contractors. Provides for the Department of Health to regulate portable restroom contractors. Provides requirements for registration and registration renewal, including an examination and work experience. Authorizes the Department of Health to adopt rules. Provides requirements for continuing education. Requires a partnership or corporation that engages in portable restroom contracting services to obtain a certificate of authorization from the department. Provides fees and penalties. Provides for certain permit fees for system construction permits for onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems to be continued rather than abolished after the 2003 fiscal year.
