The report shall include 72 73 findings of the study and recommendations for improving the 74 <u>safety of a</u>t-risk drivers. 75 (3) The department shall appoint an advisory council to 76 participate in the study and to advise the department on issues 77 related to older at-risk drivers on an ongoing basis. The 78 council shall be known as the Florida At-Risk Driver Council. 79 Members of the council shall include representatives of 80 organizations involved with issues facing older drivers, 81 including state agencies, medical professionals, senior citizen
