A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Jacksonville Seaport Authority; amending chapters 92-341 and 2001-319, Laws of Florida, as amended; changing the name of the authority; amending certain requirements relating to competitive bidding; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The introductory paragraph and subsections (1)
 and (2) of section 1, the introductory paragraph of section 3,
 section 5, subsection (a) of section 7, subsections (1) and (2)
 of section 10, and sections 12 and 13 of section 1 of chapter
 2001-319, Laws of Florida, as amended, are amended to read:
 Section 1. Creation of Jacksonville <u>Port</u> Seaport Authority
 and Jacksonville Airport Authority.--

There are hereby created and established two separate 17 (1)bodies politic and corporate to be known as the Jacksonville 18 Port Seaport Authority and the Jacksonville Airport Authority 19 respectively (hereinafter referred to singly as an "authority" 20 and collectively as "authorities"), which are created as 21 agencies and political subdivisions of the State of Florida in 22 the nature of counties and not municipalities. These authorities 23 are authorized to exercise their respective jurisdictions, 24 powers, and duties within the geographic area defined by the 25 boundary lines territorial limits of the former Duval County as 26 established by s. 7.16, Florida Statutes, which boundary lines 27 also define the geographic area of territorial limits now exist 28 within the City of Jacksonville. The Jacksonville Port Seaport 29 Authority shall operate, manage, and control the seaport and 30 Page 1 of 10

ancillary facilities located within Duval County. The Jacksonville Airport Authority shall operate, manage, and control all publicly owned airports and ancillary facilities located within Duval County. This authorization for a port authority split shall be reviewed for performance and efficiency after a period of 4 years.

The governing body for the Jacksonville Port Seaport 37 (2) Authority shall consist of seven members, four of whom shall be 38 appointed by the Mayor of the City of Jacksonville with the 39 confirmation of the council of the City of Jacksonville, and 40 41 three of whom shall be appointed by the Governor of Florida with the confirmation of the Senate. The governing body for the 42 Airport Authority shall consist of seven members, four of whom 43 shall be appointed by the Governor of Florida with the 44 confirmation of the Senate, and three of whom shall be appointed 45 by the Mayor of the City of Jacksonville with the confirmation 46 of the council of the City of Jacksonville. Members shall serve 47 for terms of 4 years commencing on October 1st of the year of 48 the appointment or for the unexpired portion of a term deemed to 49 have commenced on October 1st. Members of either authority, 50 during their terms, shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor or 51 Governor, whoever appointed the member. Members shall continue 52 to serve on either authority until their respective successors 53 are appointed. A vacancy occurring during a term of an appointed 54 member, on either authority, shall be filled only for the 55 balance of the unexpired term. Any member appointed to an 56 authority for two consecutive full terms shall not be eligible 57 for appointment to that same authority for the next succeeding 58 term. Provided, however, notwithstanding the above, members 59 initially appointed to each the authority shall serve in 60

61 staggered terms to provide continuity of experience to each
62 authority with two gubernatorial appointments and two mayoral
63 appointments being for initial 2-year terms, which shall count
64 as a full term for purposes of term limits herein.

Section 3. Powers.--Each authority shall have the below specified powers, in addition to other powers otherwise conferred by law; however, those powers that relate to maritime issues are vested in the Jacksonville <u>Port</u> Seaport Authority; those powers that relate to aviation issues are vested in the Jacksonville Airport Authority; those powers that are neutral in nature are vested in both authorities:

Section 5. Budget and finance. -- The fiscal year of each 72 authority shall commence on October 1 of each year and end on 73 the following September 30. Each authority shall prepare and 74 submit its budget to the council of the City of Jacksonville on 75 or before July 1 for the ensuing fiscal year. The council, 76 consistent with the provisions of the Charter of the City of 77 Jacksonville, may increase or decrease the appropriation 78 [budget] requested by each authority on a total basis or a line-79 by-line basis; however, the appropriation for construction, 80 reconstruction, enlargement, expansion, improvement, or 81 development of any project or projects authorized to be 82 undertaken by the Jacksonville Port Seaport Authority shall not 83 be reduced below \$800,000 for each year that the bonds to which 84 the \$800,000 is pledged remain outstanding. 85

Section 7. Rights of employees .--

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), all employment
rights and employee benefits authorized under section 11,
chapter 63-1447, Laws of Florida, as amended, are hereby
confirmed, ratified, and continued, notwithstanding the repeal

2003 of said chapter 63-1447, Laws of Florida, as amended. In order 91 to preserve the rights of employees of the former Jacksonville 92 Port Authority to continue participation in the Florida 93 Retirement System pursuant to chapter 121, Florida Statutes, 94 each separate authority created by this act shall be a county 95 agency and employees of each such authority shall participate in 96 the Florida Retirement System, notwithstanding any law to the 97 contrary. Those employees of the Jacksonville Port Authority who 98 were assigned to any activity related to the operation of the 99 marine facilities shall become employees of the Jacksonville 100 101 Port Seaport Authority created by this act. Those employees of the former Jacksonville Port Authority who were assigned to any 102 activities related to the operation of any aviation facilities 103 operated by the former Jacksonville Port Authority shall be 104 employees of the Jacksonville Airport Authority. Central 105 administrative employees shall be employed by either the 106 Jacksonville Port Seaport Authority or the Jacksonville Airport 107 Authority created by this act. It is expressly provided that 108 none of those employees of the former Jacksonville Port 109 Authority who remain with either the Jacksonville Port Seaport 110 Authority or the Jacksonville Airport Authority created by this 111 act shall lose any rights or benefits of whatsoever kind or 112 nature afforded to them by any law, ordinance, collective 113 bargaining agreement, or existing policy or plan, including, but 114 not limited to, pension benefits by virtue of the change in 115 corporate structure. In order to effectively implement the 116 foregoing, each authority shall perform all functions with 117 regard to its own employees that prior to the operation of the 118 two authorities created by this act were performed by the former 119 Jacksonville Port Authority. In order to specifically preserve 120 Page 4 of 10

HB 0647 2003 the rights of employees of the former Jacksonville Port 121 Authority to continue participation in the Florida Retirement 122 System, pursuant to chapter 121, Florida Statutes, each separate 123 authority created by this act shall be a county authority and 124 employees of each such authority who are currently participating 125 in the Florida Retirement System and all employees of each 126 authority after the effective date of this act shall participate 127 in the Florida Retirement System. 128 Section 10. Award of contracts. --129 If the total cost, value, or amount of All 130 (1)construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work of any nature 131 made by the authorities, where the entire costs, value, or 132 133 amount of such construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work, including the labor and materials, exceeds \$12,000 when 134 purchased by the Jacksonville Airport Authority and if the total 135 cost, value, or amount of construction, reconstruction, repairs 136 or work, including the labor and materials, exceeds \$50,000 when 137 purchased by the Jacksonville Port Authority, any such 138 construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work exceeding the 139 foregoing amounts established for each authority, shall be done 140 only under contract or contracts to be entered into by the 141 authorities with the lowest responsible bidder upon proper terms 142 and after due public notice has been given asking for 143 competitive bids as hereinafter provided. The foregoing 144 requirement for competitive bidding shall not apply to, except 145 construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work done by employees 146 of such authorities or by labor supplied under agreement with 147 Federal Government or state government, with supplies and 148 materials purchased as hereinafter provided, shall be done only 149 under contract or contracts to be entered into by the 150

authorities with the lowest responsible bidder upon proper 151 terms, after due public notice has been given asking for 152 competitive bids as hereinafter provided. Each authority shall 153 keep a current list of responsible bidders and, whenever the 154 authorities shall award a contract, the bidder shall come from 155 such list. No contract shall be entered into for construction, 156 improvement, or repair of any project, or any part thereof, 157 unless the contractor shall have given an undertaking with a 158 sufficient surety or sureties, approved by either authority, and 159 in an amount fixed by either authority, for the faithful 160 161 performance of the contract. All such contracts shall provide, among other things, that the person or corporation entering into 162 such contract with each authority will pay for all materials 163 furnished and services rendered for the performance of the 164 contract and that any person or corporation furnishing such 165 materials or rendering such services may maintain an action to 166 recover for the same against the obligor in the undertaking, as 167 though such person or corporation were named therein, provided 168 the action is brought within 1 year after the time the cause of 169 action accrued. Nothing in this section shall be construed to 170 limit the power of either authority to construct any project, or 171 any part thereof, or any addition, betterment, or extension 172 thereto, directly by the officers, agents, and employees of such 173 authority, or otherwise, other than by contract. 174 (2) All supplies, equipment, machinery, and materials, 175

176 <u>exceeding costing</u> \$12,000 <u>in cost purchased by the Jacksonville</u> 177 <u>Airport Authority or more</u>, shall be purchased by <u>that authority</u> 178 <u>the authorities</u> only after due advertisement as provided 179 hereinafter. <u>All supplies, equipment, machinery, and materials</u> 180 <u>exceeding \$25,000 in cost purchased by the Jacksonville Port</u>

181 Authority shall be purchased by that authority only after due advertisement as provided hereinafter. When purchasing supplies, 182 equipment, machinery, and materials pursuant to competitive bid 183 as mandated herein, each authority The authorities shall accept 184 the lowest bid or bids, kind, quality, and material being equal 185 but the authorities shall have the right to reject any or all 186 bids or select a single item from any bid. The provision as to 187 bidding shall not apply to the purchase of patented and 188 manufactured products offered for sale in a noncompetitive 189 market or solely by a manufacturer's authorized dealer. 190

Section 12. Transfer of assets and liabilities.--The
 <u>former</u> Jacksonville Port Authority shall take all actions
 necessary to convey, assign, transfer, and set over:

All of the right, title, and interests of the 194 (1)Jacksonville Port Authority in and to its marine port facilities 195 and its airport facilities, including, without limitation, its 196 real and personal property and any interests therein, books, 197 records, contracts, leases, and all other property of any kind 198 or nature related to the operation of the marine port activities 199 and airport activities, by operation of this act and without 200 further act, to the Jacksonville Port Seaport Authority or the 201 Jacksonville Airport Authority created by this act, 202 respectively, depending upon the operation or jurisdiction of 203 each such authority. 204

(2) All contracts and leases relating to <u>the former</u>
Jacksonville Port Authority's marine port operations and airport
operations, respectively, shall, by operation of this act and
without further act, become contracts and leases of the
Jacksonville <u>Port Seaport</u> Authority or the Jacksonville Airport

HB 0647 2003 Authority, respectively, depending upon the operating 210 jurisdiction of each successor authority. 211 All accounts receivable, accounts payable, and cash on 212 (3) 213 hand relating to the former Jacksonville Port Authority's marine port operations and airport operations shall, by operation of 214 this act, and without further act, be transferred or delivered 215 to the Jacksonville Port Seaport Authority or the Jacksonville 216 Airport Authority created by this act, respectively, depending 217 upon the operating jurisdiction of each such authority. 218 All operating expenses, including taxes of all kinds 219 (4) 220 and all revenue and expense accruals of the former Jacksonville Port Authority's marine operations and airport operations shall 221 be transferred to the Jacksonville Port Seaport Authority or to 222 the Jacksonville Airport Authority created by this act, 223 respectively, depending upon the operating jurisdiction of each 224 such authority, on the effective date at transfer. 225 226 The conveyances specified in this section shall be effective as 227 of October 1, 2001. 228 Section 13. Chapter 315, Florida Statutes, relating to 229 port facilities financing, also applicable .-- The provisions of 230 chapter 315, Florida Statutes, relating to port facilities 231 financing, shall also be applicable to the Jacksonville Port 232 Seaport Authority. 233 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 3 of section 2 of 234 chapter 2001-319, Laws of Florida, as amended, is amended to 235 read: 236 Repealer; abolition of Jacksonville Port 237 Section 3. Authority; assumption of responsibility.--238 Effective October 1, 2001, the former Jacksonville 239 (2) Page 8 of 10

HB 0647 2003 Port Authority, created, established, revised, or amended by the 240 above-referenced laws, is hereby abolished, and all its 241 functions, plans, projects, and programs in effect or undertaken 242 by the former Jacksonville Port Authority relative to seaport 243 operations and airport operations shall be assumed by the 244 Jacksonville Port Seaport Authority and the Jacksonville Airport 245 Authority, respectively, on that date. 246 Section 3.
