21	(c) The Legislature finds that small employers, health
22	care providers, and community-based organizations are in the

25	(d) The Legislature finds that government regulation and
26	traditional approaches to providing health care coverage can

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27 often stifle innovation and may hinder access to obtaining

29 (e) The Legislature finds that the implementation of pilot 30 projects offers viable opportunities to implement, test, and 31 evaluate locally based experimental approaches.

32 (f) The Legislature finds that pilot projects provide 33 practical means to assess measures to streamline unnecessary and 34 potentially counterproductive regulation.

35 (2)(a) It is the intent of the Legislature to expand the 36 availability of health care options for uninsured employees by 37 encouraging small employers, health care providers, and 38 community-based organizations to develop innovative alternative 39 approaches to traditional health insurance.

40 (b) It is the intent of the Legislature to establish a
41 process to review requests for the initiation of pilot projects
42 that propose innovative approaches to increase access to
43 affordable health care coverage.

44 (c) It is the intent of the Legislature to have interested
45 parties submit their pilot project proposals for consideration
46 before the 2004 Legislative Session.

47 (3) There is established a review process for submission 48 of proposals for pilot projects initiated by small employers, 49 health providers and community based organizations. Interested 50 parties shall submit proposals, with specific recommendations 51 for legislation, to the Committee on Banking and Insurance of 52 the Florida Senate and the Committee on Insurance of the Florida 53 House of Representatives by January 15, 2004. Proposals for 54 pilot projects shall be based upon the following objectives and 55 requirements:

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56	(a) The proposal shall provide health care coverage to
57	employees of small employers groups, as defined in s.
58	627.6699(3)(v), Florida Statutes, that have been without health
59	insurance for at least 6 months prior to the effective date of
60	coverage.
61	(b) To be eligible for coverage, the average income of
62	employees from each participating small employer may not exceed
63	250 percent of the federal poverty level.
64	(c) The proposal must describe the health services to be
65	offered. The nature and extent of health services provided need
66	not be subject to current requirements regarding mandated
67	benefits or limitations or restrictions regarding deductibles,
68	coinsurance, copayments, or annual or lifetime maximum payments.
69	(d) The health care coverage proposed for a pilot project
70	shall be provided in a designated geographic area.
71	(e) The proposal shall emphasize preventive care and shall
72	specify the utilization review measures which will be followed.
73	(f) The proposal must include specifics on pricing,
74	provider reimbursement, and processes to ensure actuarial and
75	fiscal soundness.
