STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
Senate Bill 724
The committee substitute replaces the original bill and
provides counties with the authority to prohibit a business from using certain names when representing itself as a county tourism-information location; creates a new provision stating
the prohibited names; and provides that a county may pass an ordinance adding names to the prohibited name list.
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
