The Legislature finds that tobacco smoking that 8 is integral to a smoking cessation program, medical research, or scientific research does not present a credible public health hazard from second-hand smoke. 10 11 Section 3. Section 386.203, Florida Statutes, is 12 amended to read: 13 386.203 Definitions.--As used in this part, the term: 14 (1) "Commercial use of a private residence" means any 15 time during which the owner, lessee, or other person occupying 16 or controlling the use of a private residence is furnishing in the private residence, or causing or allowing to be furnished 17 in the private residence, child care, adult care, or health 18 19 care, or any combination thereof, and receiving or expecting 20 to receive compensation therefor.
