A bill to be entitled

An act relating to teachers; amending s. 1012.56, F.S.; revising requirements for demonstrating mastery of general knowledge, subject area knowledge, and professional preparation and education competence for purposes of certification; revising requirements for temporary certification; amending s. 1012.58, F.S.; revising provisions relating to the Transition to Teaching Program; expanding the program to assist dislocated professionals and other baccalaureate degree holders to become teachers; authorizing teacher preparation programs for persons with noneducation majors; requiring instruction for mastery of competencies; authorizing state and federal funding; providing Transition to Teaching Program requirements; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsections (3), (4), (5), and (6) of section 1012.56, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
  - 1012.56 Educator certification requirements.--
- (3) MASTERY OF GENERAL KNOWLEDGE.--Acceptable means of demonstrating mastery of general knowledge are:
- (a) Achievement of passing scores on basic skills examination required by state board rule;
- (b) Achievement of passing scores on the College Level Academic Skills Test earned prior to July 1, 2002;
- (c) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state that requires an examination of mastery of general knowledge;

 $\underline{(c)(d)}$  A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state and valid certificate issued by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards; or

- (d)(e) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state and documentation of 2 years of continuous successful full-time teaching or administrative experience during the 5-year period immediately preceding the date of application for certification.
- (4) MASTERY OF SUBJECT AREA KNOWLEDGE. -- Acceptable means of demonstrating mastery of subject area knowledge are:
- (a) Achievement of passing scores on subject area examinations required by state board rule;
- (b) Completion of the subject area specialization requirements specified in state board rule and verification of the attainment of the essential subject matter competencies by the district school superintendent of the employing school district or chief administrative officer of the employing state-supported or private school for a subject area for which a subject area examination has not been developed and required by state board rule;
- (c) Completion of the graduate level subject area specialization requirements specified in state board rule for a subject coverage requiring a master's or higher degree and achievement of a passing score on the subject area examination specified in state board rule;
- (d) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state that requires an examination of mastery of subject area knowledge;

 $\underline{(d)}$  (e) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state and valid certificate issued by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards; or

- (e)(f) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state and documentation of 2 years of continuous successful full-time teaching or administrative experience during the 5-year period immediately preceding the date of application for certification.
- (5) MASTERY OF PROFESSIONAL PREPARATION AND EDUCATION COMPETENCE. -- Acceptable means of demonstrating mastery of professional preparation and education competence are:
- (a) Completion of an approved teacher preparation program at a postsecondary educational institution within this state and achievement of a passing score on the professional education competency examination required by state board rule;
- (b) Completion of a teacher preparation program at a postsecondary educational institution outside Florida and achievement of a passing score on the professional education competency examination required by state board rule;
- (c) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state that requires an examination of mastery of professional education competence;
- (c)(d) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state and valid certificate issued by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards;
- (d)(e) A valid standard teaching certificate issued by another state and documentation of 2 years of continuous successful full-time teaching or administrative experience during the 5-year period immediately preceding the date of application for certification;

(e)(f) Completion of professional preparation courses as specified in state board rule, successful completion of a professional education competence demonstration program pursuant to paragraph (7)(b), and achievement of a passing score on the professional education competency examination required by state board rule; or

- $\underline{(f)}(g)$  Successful completion of a professional preparation alternative certification and education competency program, outlined in paragraph (7)(a).
  - (6) TYPES AND TERMS OF CERTIFICATION. --
- (a) The Department of Education shall issue a professional certificate for a period not to exceed 5 years to any applicant who meets all the requirements outlined in subsection (2).
- (b) The department shall issue a temporary certificate to any applicant who completes the requirements outlined in paragraphs (2)(a)-(f) and completes the subject area content requirements specified in state board rule or demonstrates mastery of subject area knowledge pursuant to subsection (4) and holds an accredited degree or a degree approved by the Department of Education at the level required for the subject area specialization in state board rule.
- (c) The department shall issue one nonrenewable 2-year temporary certificate and one nonrenewable 5-year professional certificate to a qualified applicant who holds a bachelor's degree in the area of speech-language impairment to allow for completion of a master's degree program in speech-language impairment.

Each temporary certificate is valid for 3 school fiscal years and is nonrenewable. During the validity period of the temporary

certificate, all professional preparation and testing requirements must be completed to be eligible for the 5-year professional certificate and continued employment. However, the requirement in paragraph (2)(g) must be met within 1 calendar year of the date of employment under the temporary certificate. Individuals who are employed under contract at the end of the 1 calendar year time period may continue to be employed through the end of the school year in which they have been contracted. A school district shall not employ, or continue the employment of, an individual in a position for which a temporary certificate is required beyond this time period if the individual has not met the requirement of paragraph (2)(g). The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to allow the department to extend the validity period of a temporary certificate for 2 years when the requirements for the professional certificate, not including the requirement in paragraph (2)(g), were not completed due to the serious illness or injury of the applicant or other extraordinary extenuating circumstances. The department shall reissue the temporary certificate for 2 additional years upon approval by the Commissioner of Education. A written request for reissuance of the certificate shall be submitted by the district school superintendent, the governing authority of a university lab school, the governing authority of a state-supported school, or the governing authority of a private school.

Section 2. Section 1012.58, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1012.58 Transition to Teaching Program. --

(1) LEGISLATIVE INTENT.--The Transition to Teaching Program, known as the "EXPRESS TRACK," is created to encourage and assist midcareer professionals, dislocated professionals,

and other baccalaureate degree holders who want to become teachers.

- (2) Community colleges and approved teacher preparation programs are authorized to offer teacher preparation programs for baccalaureate degree holders with noneducation majors. Such programs shall provide participants with the competencies identified through the alternative certification program, as described in s. 1012.56(7), or as identified by the provider as appropriate to successfully demonstrate mastery of professional preparation and education competence, as specified in s. 1012.56(5), and to enter the classroom. Competency-based instruction should be offered in a time-shortened method, where possible. Transition to Teaching Program participants must be determined by a school district to be eligible to obtain a temporary certificate, including meeting the requirements of s. 1012.56(2)(a)-(f), except that participants may be accepted into the program if they attained a 2.5 overall grade point average on a 4.0 scale in their baccalaureate or higher degree. Participants may enter employment with a temporary certificate during the period they are completing the program, with school district approval. However, Transition to Teaching programs are encouraged to ensure that sufficient competencies are acquired by participants prior to said employment. Transition to Teaching programs shall provide assistance to potential participants in completing the requirements for demonstration of mastery of general knowledge and subject area knowledge.
  - (3)<del>(2)</del> GRANTS; FUNDING ELICIBLE APPLICANTS.--
- (a) If state or federal funds are available to support

  Transition to Teaching programs, the Commissioner of Education shall design the process for receiving and evaluating grant or

funding proposals in accordance with state and federal appropriations guidelines, as appropriate. Grants may be awarded only to the extent that funding is provided. However, community college Transition to Teaching Program completers shall be included in appropriate performance-based funding allocations.

## (4) PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS.--

(a)(b) The Commissioner of Education shall review

Transition to Teaching programs to ensure that each program

addresses the following request proposals from eligible

applicants to participate in the program. Each application must:

- 1. <u>Describes</u> Describe the target group of career-changing professionals or baccalaureate degree holders upon which the <u>program applicant</u> will focus in carrying out its program, including a description of the characteristics of the target group that shows how the knowledge and experience of its members are likely to improve their ability to become effective teachers.
- 2. <u>Describes</u> Describe how the <u>program</u> applicant will identify and recruit program participants.
- 3. <u>Describes</u> Describe how the <u>program</u> applicant will ensure that program participants are placed and teach in eligible school districts in this state.
- 4. <u>Describes</u> Describe the teacher support services that program participants will receive throughout at least their first year of teaching.
- 5. <u>Describes</u> Describe how the <u>program</u> applicant will collaborate with other institutions, agencies, or organizations, including the local workforce development agencies, to recruit, train, place, and support program participants, including

organizations to the applicant's program.

 $\underline{\text{(b)}(e)}$  The Commissioner of Education must require an evaluation process to measure the progress and effectiveness of the program. This evaluation must include:

- 1. The program's goals and objectives.
- 2. The performance indicators that the <u>program applicant</u> will use to measure the program's progress.
- 3. The outcome measures that will be used to determine the program's effectiveness, including pass rates of participants on the professional preparation examination.
- 4. An assurance that the <u>program</u> applicant will provide the commissioner with information the commissioner finds necessary to determine the overall effectiveness of the programs.
  - (5)(3) PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION; AUTHORIZED EXPENDITURES. --
- (a) An applicant shall estimate the funds required for the proposed program. All funds provided for a program must be used as authorized in federal guidelines.
- (b) Eligible <u>providers</u> applicants are encouraged to implement the program using the following components:
- (a)1. Recruiting program participants, including informing them of opportunities under the program and putting them in contact with other institutions, agencies, or organizations that will train, place, and support them in the teaching profession.
- (b)2. Tailoring Assisting providers of teacher training to tailor their training to meet the particular needs of participants professionals who are changing their careers to teaching.

 $(c)_3$ . Placement activities, including identifying eligible local education agencies with a need for the skills and characteristics of the newly trained program participants and assisting those participants to obtain employment in those school districts.

- $\underline{(d)}4$ . Postplacement support activities for program participants.
- (6)(4) ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS; REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANT REPAYMENT.--
- (a) If state or federal funds are used to support training stipends, each participant who receives a stipend grant from the program to pursue a teacher preparation program must agree to teach in an eligible school district in this state for at least 3 years after certification. To be eligible, a school district must meet the requirements established in regulations that implement the Omnibus Appropriations Bill of 2000.
- (b) The commissioner shall establish conditions under which a participant must repay all or a portion of the training stipend if the participant fails to complete his or her service obligation.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
