I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Projects, Contracts, and Grants Trust Fund; FLAIR number 482552; which is administered by the Department of Education. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004, the current termination date of the fund. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-30, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 1010.78, F.S., creates the trust fund.

The trust fund was established for receipt of federal funds for specific projects and the establishment of time-limited positions.

The major source of revenue for the trust fund is federal funds. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 1997-98 were \$330.0 million.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
