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18	WHEREAS, the State of Florida considers providing a quality
19	education to its children the highest of priorities, and
20	WHEREAS, participation in extracurricular activities is a
21	key component of school life, is essential for students applying
22	to college, and is a significant contributor to the breadth and
23	quality of the educational experience for all participants, and
24	WHEREAS, extracurricular activities are an integral part of
25	the educational process, providing personal challenges and
26	responsibility, skill in competition, teamwork cultivation, and
27	school pride, and

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28 WHEREAS, the State of Florida has a compelling interest in 29 ensuring that children are educated and compete in a safe and 30 healthy environment, and 31 WHEREAS, the use of illicit drugs, performance enhancing 32 drugs, and certain prescription drugs is considered a health and 33 safety threat within Florida's schools, playgrounds, and athletic fields and forums, and 34 35 WHEREAS, studies and pilot projects have found a 36 significant curtailment of drug use among students who are 37 subject to drug testing, NOW, THEREFORE, 38 39 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 40 41 Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 1001.43, Florida 42 Statutes, is amended to read: 43 1001.43 Supplemental powers and duties of district school 44 board. -- The district school board may exercise the following 45 supplemental powers and duties as authorized by this code or 46 State Board of Education rule. 47 STUDENT MANAGEMENT. -- The district school board may (1)48 adopt programs and policies to ensure the safety and welfare of 49 individuals, the student body, and school personnel, which programs and policies may: 50 51 Prohibit the possession of weapons and drugs on (a) 52 campus, student hazing, and other activities that could threaten 53 the operation of the school or the safety and welfare of the 54 student body or school personnel.

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(b) Require middle and high school students, as a
condition of participation in any extracurricular activity, to
consent to urinalysis testing for the presence of any drug that
may pose a threat to the health or safety of the student. The
procedures for implementing this paragraph shall be prescribed
by rules of the State Board of Education pursuant to ss.
120.536(1) and 120.54.

62 (c)(b) Require uniforms to be worn by the student body, or
 63 impose other dress-related requirements, if the district school
 64 board finds that those requirements are necessary for the safety
 65 or welfare of the student body or school personnel.

66 (d)(c) Provide procedures for student dismissal
67 precautions and for granting permission for students to leave
68 school grounds during school hours, including releasing a
69 student from school upon request by a parent or for public
70 appearances of school groups.

<u>(e)</u>(d) Provide procedures for managing protests,
demonstrations, sit-ins, walk-outs, or other acts of civil
disobedience.
