I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Certification Program Trust Fund, FLAIR number 73-2-092, which is administered by the Department of Revenue. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004, the current termination date of the fund. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-129, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 195.002(2), F.S., creates the trust fund, provides for its purpose, and provides for its revenues. The Certification Program Trust Fund was established to control and account for fees received by the Department of Revenue in furtherance of its duty to provide certification programs to property appraisers and tax collectors. The major revenues are tuition fees, examination fees, and certification fees. Actual receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$360,006.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
