I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Clerk of the Court Child Support Enforcement Collection System Trust Fund, FLAIR number 73-2-115, which is administered by the Department of Revenue. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004, the current termination date of the fund. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-121, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 61.1811, F.S., creates the trust fund and provides for its purpose. Section 61.181(2)(b), F.S., provides for its revenues. The Clerk of the Court Child Support Enforcement Collection System Trust Fund is used to control and account for moneys received for the development, implementation and operation of an automated collections system to be operated by the local depositories. The major revenues are child support payment fees charged for the administering of child support payments by the depositories. Actual receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$789,774.
