I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Working Capital Trust Fund, FLAIR number 73-2-792, which is administered by the Department of Revenue. Re-creation is effective for four years beginning on November 4, 2004, the current termination date of the fund. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-123, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

The trust fund is created in Laws of Florida, but not codified in Florida Statutes. Section 216.272, F.S., generally creates Working Capital Trust Funds for the purpose of providing sufficient funds for the operation of data processing centers. The purpose of the Working Capital Trust Fund is to provide funds for the operation of the Revenue Management Information Center. The major revenues of the fund are assessments to the agency's operating divisions for data processing services. Actual receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$4,559,080.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
