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I. Summary:

This legislation terminates and re-creates the Department of Business and Professional Regulation Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. It also synchronizes its review cycle with other trust funds of the department. The Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund, FLAIR #79-2-122, is administered by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-198, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 569.205, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides for its purpose, and provides for its revenue. The fund is used for the accounting of revenue streams from the settlement of the lawsuit initiated by the State of Florida against tobacco manufacturers and other defendants. The major source of revenue for this fund is the settlement proceeds from the tobacco lawsuit.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
