House Resolution

A resolution designating March 31-April 4, 2003, as "Ocean Education Week" and April 3, 2003, as "Ocean Education Day" in Florida.

WHEREAS, Florida is the only state in the contiguous United States bordered on three sides by the sea and, with over 8,000 miles of continuous tidal shoreline and more than 75 percent of its citizens living in counties lying along its shores, its coastal and ocean resources are vital to the state's quality of life, providing the basis for a significant part of its economic, ecological, and social well-being, and

WHEREAS, tourism, Florida's largest industry, generating more than \$40 billion in taxable spending each year, depends in large part on the oceans and beaches, as does recreational boating, which contributes over \$3.5 billion per year to the state's economy, and commercial fishing, which is valued at approximately \$900 million annually; and the state's 14 deepwater ports handle over \$40 billion worth of imports and exports, are expected to reach \$130 billion in trade by 2005, and serve over 80 percent of homeport cruise passenger movements in North America, and

WHEREAS, acutely aware of the need to coordinate the protection, enhancement, and management of the state's ocean resources, Mote Marine Laboratory, the Florida Institute of Oceanography, and the Florida Ocean Alliance, a nonprofit, nonpartisan, public-private partnership of ocean-related interests, place great emphasis on educating Florida's school children in marine science, and the Sea Trek and JASON distance learning programs bring live interactive marine science

curriculum to students throughout Florida through the use of Internet2 and satellite technology, and

WHEREAS, in their efforts to promote awareness and understanding of the ocean's importance to the ecology and economy of Florida and its neighbors, Mote Marine Laboratory, the Florida Institute of Oceanography, and the Florida Ocean Alliance have organized ocean-related exhibitions and a reception for Legislators and governmental officials at the Capitol during "Ocean Education Week," NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That, in recognition of the importance of Florida's ocean resources, and in an effort to promote public awareness of the need to protect these resources, the House of Representatives designates March 31-April 4, 2003, as "Ocean Education Week" and April 3, 2003, as "Ocean Education Day" in Florida.
