House Resolution

A resolution recognizing April 15, 2003, as "University of Florida Day" in Tallahassee.

WHEREAS, the University of Florida, Florida's largest and oldest land-grant institution, a leading institution of higher learning in the state, and the only Florida university honored by membership in the prestigious Association of American Universities, is celebrating its 150th anniversary during 2003, and

WHEREAS, the university, Florida's largest, ranks third in the nation of all AAU universities in bachelor's degrees awarded to both African-American and Latino students and enrolls more than 47 thousand students from all of Florida's 67 counties, all 50 states, and more than 100 countries, making it the fourth largest campus in the country and one of cultural and intellectual diversity, while also significantly extending the ideals of the American and Florida higher education system worldwide, and

WHEREAS, the university ranks first among all public universities in the number of National Achievement Scholars enrolled in the fall 2002 freshman class and second in enrolling National Merit Scholars in that same class, and its outstanding freshman-to-sophomore retention rate of 93 percent underlines the outstanding quality of its entire academic experience, including several top-20-ranked academic programs, personal academic and career advising, and sophisticated online programs that provide self-tracking of academic progress, and

WHEREAS, a center of distinguished colleges and highly advanced liberal arts and sciences programs, the university has

been classified by the Carnegie Foundation as a top "Research Extensive" institution, and its fine faculty, staff, and student body have accomplished world-class results in numerous areas of healthcare research, including dentistry, disease-combatting genes, and a vaccine designed to defeat the spread of feline immunodeficiency virus; in food and agricultural sciences, where a product has been developed to more effectively reduce termite devastation; in physical sciences, where a challenge is being dared to develop the next-generation near-space transport system; and in engineering, where efforts are being made to apply computerized strategies to designing newer and safer structures such as bridges and piers, and

WHEREAS, the University of Florida consistently excels in its student athletics programs, creating exceptional opportunities for young men and women to experience the joy and rugged self-discipline of student athleticism, with results that rank the school's overall intercollegiate sports programs as one of the top five in the country, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives recognizes the singular contributions made by the University of Florida to the state, to the nation, and throughout the world since its inception 150 years ago and enthusiastically recognizes April 15, 2003, as "University of Florida Day" in Tallahassee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be presented to Dr. Charles E. Young, President of the University of Florida, as a tangible token of the sentiments expressed
