I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Department of Business and Professional Regulation Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund, FLAIR #79-2-865, is administered by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. This fund was last re-created effective July 1, 2001, by Chapter 2001-231, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Sections 723.06115 and 723.612, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides for its purpose, and provides for its revenue. The fund is used for collecting and disbursing payments when mobile home park owners relocate mobile homes due to a change in land use. The sources of revenue are fees from mobile home park owners and from other appropriated funds. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2001-2002 were \$0.5 million.
