I. Summary:

This legislation terminates and re-creates the Workers' Compensation Administration Trust without modification. It also synchronizes its review cycle with other trust funds of the department. The Workers' Compensation Administration Trust Fund, FLAIR # 72-2-795, is administered by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. This fund was last re-created effective July 1, 2002, by Chapter 2002-399, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 440.501, F.S., creates the trust fund, provides for its purpose, and provides for revenues. The trust fund supports the Child and Farm Labor Program. The major source of revenue for this fund is a transfer from the Department of Financial Services. According to Comptroller data, expected receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 will be \$1 million.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
