- A. Basic Information:
 - 1. Claimants: John Martz
 - 2. Respondent: Hernando County
 - 3. Amount Requested: \$500,000

- 6. Collateral Sources: Auto liability insurance covered \$20,000 in PIP and medical payments; Blue Cross/Blue Shield had a subrogation interest of \$144,757.76 which was negotiated down to \$87,402.39.
 7. Prior Legislative History: None.
- 8. Attorney's Fees Attorney's fees have been limited to 25% of the initial \$2 million settlement; the claimant's attorney reduced his fee to 10% of the remaining \$500,000. Costs total \$45,071.08. Attorney's fees and costs are included in the settlement amount.
- **B. Procedural Summary:** John Martz's mother and natural guardian Mary Beth Gary filed suit against Hernando County for injuries and damages suffered by John as a result of a motor vehicle accident. The suit alleged negligence by the County for failure to warn and failure to maintain Powell Road. Prior to trial the parties entered into a settlement agreement as a result of mediation.
- C. Facts of Case: On February 20, 2000, John Martz, then 16 years old, was traveling on Powell Road when his passenger tires left the roadway and went into a large rut immediately adjacent to the roadway. The rut was 8 inches deep at its deepest point. In an attempt to bring his car back onto the roadway he lost control and hit a tree. As a result of the accident, John is a quadriplegic. His medical bills to date total \$612,835.57. In spite of his accident, John graduated as the valedictorian of his high school class and is now attending Stetson University seeking a degree in Finance.
