I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Forfeiture and Investigative Support Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Forfeiture and Investigative Support Trust Fund, FLAIR #71-2-316, is administered by the Department of Law Enforcement. This fund was created by Chapter 98-364.

II. Present Situation:

As provided in 943.362(2) moneys in the Forfeiture and Investigative Support Trust Fund are appropriated by the Legislature for purposes deemed appropriate by the Legislature. The trust fund may be used for protracted investigative expenses, overtime pay for sworn agents, specialized equipment, computers, additional motor vehicles, and as state matching funds for federal grants.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
