This bill terminates the Consumer Fraud Trust Fund, FLAIR #41-2-127, within the Department of Legal Affairs.

This bill terminates the Florida Agricultural Exposition Trust Fund, FLAIR #70-2-298, within the Department of Corrections.

This bill exempts the Inmate Bank Trust Fund within the Department of Corrections from the termination requirements of s. 19(f), Art III of the State Constitution.

II. Present Situation:

The Inmate Bank Trust Fund within the Department of Corrections is currently exempt.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill terminates the Consumer Fraud Trust Fund within the Department of Legal Affairs and transfers the remaining balance to the General Revenue Fund. The bill amends s. 501.2101, 501.059, 501.143, 501.2077, F. S. to conform to the termination of the Consumer Fraud Trust Fund. The bill terminates the Florida Agricultural Exposition Trust Fund within the Department of Corrections and transfers the remaining balance to the General Revenue Fund.
