An act relating to the Florida Civil R

An act relating to the Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992; providing that this act shall be known by the popular name the "Dr. Marvin Davies Florida Civil Rights Act"; creating s. 760.021, F.S.; authorizing the Attorney General to commence a civil action to obtain damages or other relief for a civil rights violation under certain circumstances; providing for attorney's fees and costs; amending s. 16.57, F.S.; authorizing the Attorney General to investigate violations under ch. 760, F.S.; amending s. 760.02, F.S.; defining "public accommodations"; creating 760.08, F.S.; making unlawful discrimination or segregation in places of public accommodation; providing for construction of the act in pari materia with laws enacted during the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. This act shall be known by the popular name the "Dr. Marvin Davies Florida Civil Rights Act."
- Section 2. Section 760.021, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 760.021 Enforcement.--If the Attorney General has reasonable cause to believe that:
- (1) Any person or group of persons is engaged in a pattern or practice of discrimination as defined by the laws of this state; or
- (2) Any person or group of persons has been discriminated against as defined by the laws of this state and such

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HB 0123A 2003 discrimination raises an issue of general public importance, 32 the Attorney General may commence a civil action in any 33 appropriate court for damages, injunctive relief, civil 34 penalties not to exceed \$10,000 per violation, and such other 35 relief as may be appropriate under the circumstances. Any 36 damages recovered under this section shall accrue to the injured 37 person or group of persons. The Attorney General is entitled to 38 an award of reasonable attorney's fees and costs if the 39 Department of Legal Affairs prevails in an action brought under 40 41 this section. Section 3. Section 16.57, Florida Statutes, is amended to 42 43 read: 16.57 Office of Civil Rights. -- There is created in the 44 Department of Legal Affairs an Office of Civil Rights. The 45 office may investigate and initiate actions authorized by 46 chapter 760 s. 760.51. In investigating violations of 47 constitutional and statutory rights under chapter 760 s. 760.51, 48 the Attorney General may administer oaths and affirmations, 49 subpoena witnesses or matter, and collect evidence. 50 Section 4. Subsection (11) is added to section 760.02, 51 Florida Statutes, to read: 52 760.02 Definitions.--For the purposes of ss. 760.01-760.11 53 and 509.092, the term: 54 (11) "Public accommodations" means places of public 55 accommodation, lodgings, facilities principally engaged in 56 selling food for consumption on the premises, gasoline stations, 57 places of exhibition or entertainment, and other covered 58 establishments. Each of the following establishments which 59

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serves the public is a place of public accommodation within the

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meaning of this section:

(a) Any inn, hotel, motel, or other establishment which provides lodging to transient guests, other than an establishment located within a building which contains not more than four rooms for rent or hire and which is actually occupied by the proprietor of such establishment as his or her residence.

- (b) Any restaurant, cafeteria, lunchroom, lunch counter, soda fountain, or other facility principally engaged in selling food for consumption on the premises, including, but not limited to, any such facility located on the premises of any retail establishment, or any gasoline station.
- (c) Any motion picture house, theater, concert hall, sports arena, stadium, or other place of exhibition or entertainment.
- (d) Any establishment which is physically located within the premises of any establishment otherwise covered by this subsection, or within the premises of which is physically located any such covered establishment, and which holds itself out as serving patrons of such covered establishment.
- Section 5. Section 760.08, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 760.08 Discrimination in places of public accommodation.-All persons shall be entitled to the full and equal enjoyment of
 the goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages, and
 accommodations of any place of public accommodation, as defined
 in this chapter, without discrimination or segregation on the
 ground of race, color, national origin, sex, handicap, familial
 status, or religion.
- Section 6. If any law amended by this act was also amended by a law enacted at the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature,
