Paragraphs (mm) and (nn) are added to subsection (4) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, to read: 12 320.08056 Specialty license plates.--13 The following license plate annual use fees shall be 14 collected for the appropriate specialty license plates: 15 (mm) Live the Dream license plate, \$25. 16 (nn) UNITY license plate, \$25. 17 Subsections (39) and (40) are added to section Section 2. 18 320.08058, Florida Statutes, to read: 19 320.08058 Specialty license plates.--20 (39) LIVE THE DREAM LICENSE PLATES.--21 The department shall develop a Live the Dream license 22 plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must 23 appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Live the Dream" 24 must appear at the bottom of the plate. 25

- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Dream Foundation, Inc., which may use up to 25 percent of the proceeds to market the organization's concept and the license plate. The remaining funds shall be used in the following manner:
 - 1. The Dream Foundation, Inc., shall retain all revenues

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from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plates have been recovered.

- 2. Fifteen percent shall be distributed to the March of Dimes Florida Chapter.
- 3. Ten percent shall be distributed to the Florida Association of Healthy Start Coalitions.
- 4. Twenty-five percent shall be distributed as grants for programs that provide research, care, and treatment for sickle cell disease.
- 5. Twenty percent shall be distributed to programs that provide relief for poverty, hunger, and homelessness as follows: five percent to the Community Partnership for Homeless, Inc., Miami, Florida; five percent to the I.M. Sulzbacher Center for the Homeless, Inc., Jacksonville, Florida; five percent to the Anthony House for the Homeless, Zellwood, Florida; and five percent to the Homeless Emergency Project, Inc., Clearwater, Florida.
- 6. Five percent shall be expended by the Dream Foundation, Inc., for administrative costs directly associated with the foundation's operations as they relate to the programs described in this paragraph.
 - (40) UNITY LICENSE PLATES. --
- (a) The department shall develop a UNITY license plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word "UNITY" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the British-American Foundation, Inc. Up to 25 percent of such funds shall be used for marketing and promotion of the "UNITY" concept and license plate. The remaining funds shall be used in the



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following manner:

1. Twenty-five percent shall be used to establish and administer advice centers that will provide informative and educational informational materials and referral services to assist recently arrived residents, prospective residents, and individuals in adapting to living, working, and doing business in the State of Florida, particularly to prevent fraudulent conduct.

- 2. Twenty percent shall be distributed as grants, as determined by an internal review committee, to organizations whose efforts are specifically directed toward protecting Florida residents from fraudulent business practices, corporate scams, identity theft, and other fraud.
- 3. Ten percent shall be distributed to identified agencies to assist them with efforts that are specifically directed toward providing Florida residents with a toll-free hotline to fight fraud and corporate scams.
- 4. Ten percent shall be used to pay the cost of professional staff who will administer advice and guidance to protect Florida residents from fraudulent business practices, to promote ethical business practices, and to provide informational seminars disseminating information and materials to prevent fraudulent conduct.
- 5. Ten percent shall be expended by the British-American Foundation, Inc., for administrative costs directly associated with the foundation's operations as they relate to its goals of fighting fraud.
- Section 3. If any law amended by this act was also amended by a law enacted at the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature, such laws shall be construed as if they had been enacted at the



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same session of the Legislature, and full effect shall be given

to each if possible.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.

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
