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20	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:		
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22	Section 1. Section 1003.433, Florida Statutes, is created		
23	to read:		
24	1003.433 Learning opportunities for out-of-state and out-		
25	of-country transfer students and students needing additional		
26	instruction to meet high school graduation requirements		
27	(1) Students who enter a Florida public school at the		
28	eleventh or twelfth grade from out of state or from a foreign		
29	country shall not be required to spend additional time in a		
30	Florida public school in order to meet the high school course		
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31	requirements if the student has met all requirements of the
32	school district, state, or country from which he or she is
33	transferring. Such students who are not proficient in English
34	should receive immediate and intensive instruction in English
35	language acquisition. However, to receive a standard high school
36	diploma, a transfer student must earn a 2.0 grade point average
37	and pass the grade 10 FCAT required in s. 1008.22(3) or an
38	alternate assessment as described in s. 1008.22(9).
39	(2) Students who have met all requirements for the
40	standard high school diploma except for passage of the grade 10
41	FCAT or an alternate assessment by the end of grade 12 must be
42	provided the following learning opportunities:
43	(a) Participation in an accelerated high school
44	equivalency diploma preparation program during the summer.
45	(b) Upon receipt of a certificate of completion, be
46	allowed to take the College Placement Test and be admitted to
47	remedial or credit courses at a state community college, as
48	appropriate.
49	(c) Participation in an adult general education program as
50	provided in s. 1004.93 for such time as the student requires to
51	master English, reading, mathematics, or any other subject
52	required for high school graduation. Students attending adult
53	basic, adult secondary, or vocational-preparatory instruction
54	are exempt from any requirement for the payment of tuition and
55	fees, including lab fees, pursuant to s. 1009.25. A student
56	attending an adult general education program shall have the
57	opportunity to take the grade 10 FCAT an unlimited number of
58	times in order to receive a standard high school diploma.
59	(3) Students who have been enrolled in an ESOL program for
60	less than 2 school years and have met all requirements for the
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61	standard high school diploma except for passage of the grade 10
62	FCAT or alternate assessment may receive immersion English
63	language instruction during the summer following their senior
64	year. Students receiving such instruction are eligible to take
65	the FCAT or alternate assessment and receive a standard high
66	school diploma upon passage of the grade 10 FCAT or the
67	alternate assessment. This subsection shall be implemented to
68	the extent funding is provided in the General Appropriations
69	<u>Act.</u>
70	(4) The State Board of Education may adopt rules pursuant

78	(3) STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT PROGRAMThe commissioner shall

The tests measure student skills and competencies 1. 93 94 adopted by the State Board of Education as specified in The tests must measure and report student paragraph (a). 95 proficiency levels in reading, writing, mathematics, and 96 The commissioner shall provide for the tests to be 97 science. developed or obtained, as appropriate, through contracts and 98 project agreements with private vendors, public vendors, public 99 agencies, postsecondary educational institutions, or school 100 101 districts. The commissioner shall obtain input with respect to the design and implementation of the testing program from state 102 103 educators and the public.

2. The testing program will include a combination of normreferenced and criterion-referenced tests and include, to the extent determined by the commissioner, questions that require the student to produce information or perform tasks in such a way that the skills and competencies he or she uses can be measured.

3. Each testing program, whether at the elementary, middle, or high school level, includes a test of writing in which students are required to produce writings that are then scored by appropriate methods.

4. A score is designated for each subject area tested,
below which score a student's performance is deemed inadequate.
The school districts shall provide appropriate remedial
instruction to students who score below these levels.

5. Except as provided in s. 1003.43(11)(b), students must
earn a passing score on the grade 10 assessment test described
in this paragraph or on an alternate assessment as described in

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HB 0023B 2003 subsection (9) in reading, writing, and mathematics to qualify 121 for a regular high school diploma. The State Board of Education 122 shall designate a passing score for each part of the grade 10 123 assessment test. In establishing passing scores, the state board 124 shall consider any possible negative impact of the test on 125 minority students. All students who took the grade 10 FCAT 126 during the 2000-2001 school year shall be required to earn the 127 passing scores in reading and mathematics established by the 128 State Board of Education for the March 2001 test administration. 129 Such students who did not earn the established passing scores 130 131 and must repeat the grade 10 FCAT are required to earn the passing scores established for the March 2001 test 132 133 administration. All students who take the grade 10 FCAT for the first time in March 2002 and thereafter shall be required to 134 earn the passing scores in reading and mathematics established 135 by the State Board of Education for the March 2002 test 136 administration. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules 137 which specify the passing scores for the grade 10 FCAT. Any such 138 rules, which have the effect of raising the required passing 139 scores, shall only apply to students taking the grade 10 FCAT 140 after such rules are adopted by the State Board of Education. 141

Participation in the testing program is mandatory for 6. 142 all students attending public school, including students served 143 in Department of Juvenile Justice programs, except as otherwise 144 prescribed by the commissioner. If a student does not 145 participate in the statewide assessment, the district must 146 notify the student's parent and provide the parent with 147 information regarding the implications of such nonparticipation. 148 If modifications are made in the student's instruction to 149 provide accommodations that would not be permitted on the 150

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HB 0023B 2003 statewide assessment tests, the district must notify the 151 student's parent of the implications of such instructional 152 modifications. A parent must provide signed consent for a 153 student to receive instructional modifications that would not be 154 permitted on the statewide assessments and must acknowledge in 155 writing that he or she understands the implications of such 156 accommodations. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules, 157 based upon recommendations of the commissioner, for the 158 provision of test accommodations and modifications of procedures 159 as necessary for students in exceptional education programs and 160 161 for students who have limited English proficiency. Accommodations that negate the validity of a statewide 162 assessment are not allowable. 163

7. A student seeking an adult high school diploma must
meet the same testing requirements that a regular high school
student must meet.

8. District school boards must provide instruction to 167 prepare students to demonstrate proficiency in the skills and 168 competencies necessary for successful grade-to-grade progression 169 and high school graduation. If a student is provided with 170 accommodations or modifications that are not allowable in the 171 statewide assessment program, as described in the test manuals, 172 the district must inform the parent in writing and must provide 173 the parent with information regarding the impact on the 174 student's ability to meet expected proficiency levels in 175 reading, writing, and math. The commissioner shall conduct 176 studies as necessary to verify that the required skills and 177 competencies are part of the district instructional programs. 178 179 9. The Department of Education must develop, or select,

and implement a common battery of assessment tools that will be

These tools 181 must accurately measure the skills and competencies established 182 in the Florida Sunshine State Standards. 183 184 The commissioner may design and implement student testing 185 programs, for any grade level and subject area, necessary to 186 effectively monitor educational achievement in the state. 187 EQUIVALENCIES FOR STANDARDIZED TESTS. -- The 188 (9) Commissioner of Education shall determine the comparable 189 validity of other available standardized tests, including the 190 191 SAT, ACT, College Placement Test, PSAT, PLAN, and tests used for entry into the military. If such tests are deemed to be valid 192 193 and reliable measures, the commissioner shall approve the use of such tests as alternate assessments to the grade 10 FCAT. 194 Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, students who attain 195 scores that equate to the passing scores on the grade 10 FCAT 196 for purposes of high school graduation on any of the approved 197 alternate assessments shall satisfy the assessment requirement 198 for a standard high school diploma as provided in s. 199 1003.43(5)(a). 200 If any law amended by this act was also amended Section 3. 201 by a law enacted at the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature 202 or at the 2003 Special Session A of the Legislature, such laws 203 shall be construed as if they had been enacted at the same 204 session of the Legislature, and full effect shall be given to 205 each if possible. 206 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. 207
