Section 47. Section 1004.085, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1004.085 Informed consent standardization project.--Every public school, college, and university that offers degrees in medicine, nursing, and allied health shall work with the Department of Health to develop bilingual, multimedia methods for communicating the risks of treatment options for medical procedures. Such materials shall be provided to patients and their families in an effort to educate them and to obtain the informed consent to prescribe a treatment procedure. The department shall develop a list of treatment procedures based on significance of risk and frequency of performance.
