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- (b) Where the jury determines that there is a substantial or permanent loss or impairment of a bodily function or substantial disfigurement, in a wrongful death action where the limitation on noneconomic damages would deprive the survivor of fair compensation, or other special circumstances in the case which warrant an award in excess of the limitations set forth in subsection (1).
- (3) The Chief Financial Officer shall adjust the limitation on noneconomic damages by an amount determined at the end of each calendar year to reflect the cumulative annual percentage change in the consumer price index. As used in this subsection, "consumer price index" shall mean the most comprehensive index of consumer prices available for this state from the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor.
- (4) The court shall instruct the jury that in the event they find a defendant liable, they shall not award any plaintiff or survivor more than \$850,000 against any one defendant for noneconomic damages unless the jury determines a higher award is justified based upon the criteria set forth in subsection (2).
