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Representative Seiler offered the following:

Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove line(s) 1827-1835, and insert:

766.118 Determination of noneconomic damages.--

(1) Except as provided in subsection (2), in an action for damages for medical malpractice, the noneconomic damages awarded to each plaintiff in a personal injury action or each statutory survivor under s. 768.21 in a wrongful death action, as applied to each defendant who is a party to the action, shall not exceed \$850,000.

(2) In an action for damages for medical malpractice, the limitation on noneconomic damages set forth in subsection (1) shall not apply:

(a) To an action in which the conduct of the defendant is determined to constitute gross negligence, or reckless, willful or wanton conduct.

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28 (b) Where the jury determines that there is a substantial
 29 or permanent loss or impairment of a bodily function or
 30 substantial disfigurement, in a wrongful death action where the
 31 limitation on noneconomic damages would deprive the survivor of
 32 fair compensation, or other special circumstances in the case
 33 which warrant an award in excess of the limitations set forth in
 34 subsection (1).

35 (3) The Chief Financial Officer shall adjust the
 36 limitation on noneconomic damages by an amount determined at the
 37 end of each calendar year to reflect the cumulative annual
 38 percentage change in the consumer price index. As used in this
 39 subsection, "consumer price index" shall mean the most
 40 comprehensive index of consumer prices available for this state
 41 from the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of
 42 Labor.

43 (4) The court shall instruct the jury that in the event
 44 they find a defendant liable, they shall not award any plaintiff
 45 or survivor more than \$850,000 against any one defendant for
 46 noneconomic damages unless the jury determines a higher award is
 47 justified based upon the criteria set forth in subsection (2).
