Amendment (with title amendment)

Between lines 710 and 711, insert:

Section 5. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$10 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to state universities for infrastructure improvements to the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory. From this appropriation, \$7.5 million shall be allocated to Florida State University and \$2.5 million shall be allocated to the University of Florida to address infrastructure requirements identified in consultation with the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory Executive Committee.

Section 6. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$5 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the

30 Section 7. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$10
31 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the

34 s. 288.1254, Florida Statutes.

35 Section 8. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$25
36 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the
37 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the Rural
38 Infrastructure Fund pursuant to s. 288.0655, Florida Statutes.

39 Section 9. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$10
40 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the
41 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the Quick
42 Action Closing Fund pursuant to s. 288.1088, Florida Statutes.

43 Section 10. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$25
44 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the
45 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the
46 Florida Black Business Investment Board, Inc., pursuant to s.
47 288.707, Florida Statutes.

48 Section 11. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$5
49 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the
50 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the
51 Hispanic Business Initiative Fund.

52 Section 12. For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$10
53 million is appropriated from nonrecurring general revenue to the
54 Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for the
55 Florida Tourism Industry Marketing Corporation pursuant to s.
56 288.1226, Florida Statutes.

An act relating to economic development; creating s.

Florida Funding Corporation to facilitate the
establishment and operation of a biomedical research
institution for the purposes of enhancing education and
research and promoting economic development and diversity;
providing for a board of directors; prohibiting conflicts
of interest; providing penalties; providing powers and
duties of the corporation; providing for investment of
funds; requiring an operating plan; requiring the
corporation and a grantee entity to enter into a contract;
providing contract requirements; providing for performance
expectations and performance measures; providing
requirements and criteria; providing for disbursement and
reinvestment of funds; requiring reports, audits, and
evaluations; limiting the use of funds; providing that the
appropriation of funds does not constitute a debt of the
state or a subdivision of the state, nor does it subject
the state or a subdivision to liability; providing for
extension of certain deadlines in certain situations in
which the grantee cannot meet contract conditions, with
limitations; providing for resumption of such deadlines;
amending s. 20.435, F.S.; providing for additional funds
to be deposited into the Biomedical Research Trust Fund;
deleting a provision for future termination date of the
fund; amending s. 403.973, F.S.; specifying that projects

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86 that are part of the biomedical research institution and
87 campus are eligible for the expedited permitting process;
88 providing for challenges to state agency action in
89 expedited permitting related to the institution and
90 campus; providing legislative intent with respect to
91 creating economic opportunity and improving public health
92 through the establishment of a biomedical research
93 institution; providing appropriations; providing an
94 effective date.
