Residency in this state must be for purposes other than to obtain an education. Resident status for purposes of 72 receiving state financial aid awards shall be determined in the 73 same manner as resident status for tuition purposes pursuant to 74 s. 1009.21 and rules of the State Board of Education. 75

Submission of certification attesting to the accuracy, 3. 76 completeness, and correctness of information provided to 77 demonstrate a student's eligibility to receive state financial 78 aid awards. Falsification of such information shall result in 79 the denial of any pending application and revocation of any 80 award currently held to the extent that no further payments 81 shall be made. Additionally, students who knowingly make false 82 statements in order to receive state financial aid awards shall 83 be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree subject to the 84 provisions of s. 837.06 and shall be required to return all 85 state financial aid awards wrongfully obtained. 86

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Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
