Section 7. There are hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2003-2004 the following amounts to the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development for strategic economic development and initiatives:

(1) The sum of \$10 million from the General Revenue Fund to the entertainment industry financial incentive program created in s. 288.1254, Florida Statutes.

(2) The sum of \$10 million from the General Revenue Fund to the Quick Action Closing Fund created in s. 288.1088, Florida

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27 Statutes, all of which shall be used to fund projects in rural
28 communities as defined in s. 288.0656(2)(b), Florida Statutes.

29 (3) The sum of \$15 million from the General Revenue Fund
30 to the Rural Infrastructure Fund created in s. 288.0655, Florida
31 Statutes.

32 (4) The sum of \$7.5 million from the General Revenue Fund
33 for fixed capital outlay military base retention projects
34 allocated to the following bases: Tyndall (\$2.5 million),
35 Mayport (\$2.5 million), and McDill (\$2.5 million).

36 (5) The sum of \$10 million from the General Revenue Fund
37 for the purpose of providing one-time fixed capital outlay
38 grants for infrastructure improvements related to the National
39 High Magnetic Field Laboratory, which shall be allocated as
40 follows: the sum of \$7.5 million shall be allocated to Florida
41 State University and the sum of \$2.5 million shall be allocated
42 to the University of Florida.

43 (6) The sum of \$10 million from the General Revenue Fund
44 to fund the first ranked fixed capital outlay project of the
45 Regional Cultural Facilities Program Rollover Priority List from
46 fiscal year 2003-2004, which was developed in accordance with
47 1T-1.001(20), Florida Administrative Code.

48 (7) The sum of \$1 million from the General Revenue Fund to
49 the Mote Marine Laboratory, Inc., for scientific research to
50 prevent harmful algal blooms for the purpose of enhancing
51 Florida seafood production.

52 (8) The sum of \$8 million from the General Revenue Fund
53 for the purpose of providing a one-time fixed capital outlay
54 grant to the University of South Florida to acquire the Fowler

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55 Avenue South site as part of its Bioengineering and Life
56 Sciences Research Park.

57 (9) For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$25 million
58 from nonrecurring general revenue for the Florida Black Business
59 Investment Board, Inc., created in s. 288.707, Florida Statutes.

60 (10) For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$5 million
61 from nonrecurring general revenue for the Hispanic Business
62 Initiative Fund.

63 (11) For the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the sum of \$10 million
64 from nonrecurring general revenue for the Florida Tourism
65 Industry Marketing Corporation created in s. 288.1226, Florida
66 Statutes.
