A bill to be entitled

An act relating to firesafety; amending s. 633.171, F.S.; prohibiting installation of fireworks or pyrotechnic devices in certain facilities under certain circumstances; providing for installation pursuant to a permit; providing penalties; amending s. 633.821, F.S.; authorizing the Division of State Fire Marshal to adopt certain rules relating to workplace firesafety; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsection (3) is added to section 633.171, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 633.171 Penalty for violation of law, rule, or order to cease and desist or for failure to comply with corrective order.--
- (3)(a) An owner or operator of any indoor facility shall not install or knowingly allow the installation of fireworks or any pyrotechnic device inside such facility without a fire suppression system or without first obtaining a permit from the local fire marshal.
- (b) A vendor or licensee shall not install any fireworks or pyrotechnic device in any indoor facility without a fire suppression system unless the vendor or licensee first obtains a permit from the local fire marshal, furnishes a copy of the permit to the owner or operator of the facility, and obtains prior written consent of the owner or operator to install the fireworks or a pyrotechnic device inside the facility pursuant to the permit.

(c) The provisions of this section do not apply to the manufacture, distribution, sale at wholesale or retail, or seasonal retail sale of products regulated pursuant to chapter 791 if such products are not used or intended to be used within an indoor facility.

- (d) A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 633.821, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
  - 633.821 Workplace safety.--
- (2) The division shall have the authority to adopt rules for the purpose of ensuring safe working conditions for all firefighter employees by authorizing the enforcement of effective standards, by assisting and encouraging firefighter employers to maintain safe working conditions, and by providing for education and training in the field of safety. Specifically, the division may by rule adopt all or any part of subparts C through T and subpart Z of 29 C.F.R. s. 1910, as revised April 8, 1998; the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Standard 1500, paragraph 5-7 (Personal Alert Safety System) (1992 edition); the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions (1997 edition); and ANSI A 10.4-1990.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
