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CS 24 Rehabilitative Industries and Diversified Enterprises, 25 Inc., to study the possibility of using direct-to-customer 26 distribution; requiring an analysis of the impact of 27 certain technologies; requiring the department to report its findings to the Legislature; providing an effective 28 29 date. 30 31 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 32 33 Section 1. Section 320.08053, Florida Statutes, is amended 34 to read: 35 320.08053 Requirements for requests to establish specialty 36 license plates.--An organization that seeks authorization to establish 37 (1)38 a new specialty license plate for which an annual use fee is to 39 be charged must submit to the department: 40 A request for the particular specialty license plate (a) being sought, describing the proposed specialty license plate in 41 42 specific general terms, including a sample plate that conforms 43 to the specifications set by the department and this chapter and that is in substantially final form. 44 45 (b) The results of a scientific sample survey of Florida motor vehicle owners that indicates at least 30,000 15,000 motor 46 47 vehicle owners intend to purchase the proposed specialty license 48 plate at the increased cost. As used in this paragraph, the term 49 "scientific sample survey" means information that is gathered 50 from a representative subset of the population as a whole. The 51 sample survey of registered motor vehicle owners must be

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52 performed independently of the requesting organization by an 53 organization that conducts similar sample surveys as a normal 54 course of business. Prior to conducting a sample survey for the 55 purposes of this section, a requesting organization must obtain 56 a determination from the department that the organization 57 selected to conduct the survey performs similar surveys as a normal course of business and is independent of the requesting 58 59 organization. The methodology, results, and any evaluation by the department of the scientific sample survey shall be 60 61 validated by the Auditor General as a condition precedent to 62 submission of the specialty license plate for approval by the 63 Legislature.

64 An application fee, not to exceed \$60,000, to defray (C) 65 the department's cost for reviewing the application and 66 developing the specialty license plate, if authorized. State 67 funds may not be used to pay the application fee, except for 68 collegiate specialty license plates authorized in s. 320.08058(3) and (13). The specialty license plate application 69 70 provisions of this act shall not apply to any organization which 71 has requested and received the required forms for obtaining a 72 specialty license plate authorization from the Department of 73 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, has opened a bank account for 74 the funds collected for the specialty license tag and has made deposits to such an account, and has obtained signatures toward 75 completing the requirements for the specialty license tag. All 76 applications requested on or after the effective date of this 77 act must meet the requirements of this act. 78

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(d) A marketing strategy outlining short-term and longterm marketing plans for the requested specialty license plate and a financial analysis outlining the anticipated revenues and the planned expenditures of the revenues to be derived from the sale of the requested specialty license plates.

The information required under this subsection must be submitted to the department at least 90 days before the convening of the next regular session of the Legislature.

If the specialty license plate requested by the 88 (2) 89 organization is approved by law, the organization must submit the proposed art design for the specialty license plate to the 90 91 department, in a medium prescribed by the department, as soon as practicable, but no later than 60 days after the act approving 92 93 the specialty license plate becomes a law. If the specialty 94 license plate requested by the organization is not approved by 95 the Legislature, the application fee shall be refunded to the requesting organization. 96

97 (3) The department shall adopt rules providing viewpointneutral specifications for the design of specialty license 98 plates that promote or enhance the readability of all specialty 99 100 license plates and that discourage counterfeiting. The rules shall provide uniform specifications requiring inclusion of the 101 102 word "Florida" in the same location on each specialty license plate, in such a size and location that is clearly identifiable 103 104 on the specialty license plate when mounted on a vehicle, and 105 shall provide specifications for the size and location of any 106 words or logos appearing on a specialty license plate.

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107 Section 2. Subsections (6), (7), and (8) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 108 109

320.08056 Specialty license plates .--

110 Specialty license plates must bear the design required (6) 111 by law for the appropriate specialty license plate, and the 112 designs and colors must conform to the department's design specifications be approved by the department. In addition to a 113 design, the specialty license plates may bear the imprint of 114 numerals from 1 to 999, inclusive, capital letters "A" through 115 116 "Z," or a combination thereof. The department shall determine 117 the maximum number of characters, including both numerals and 118 letters. All specialty license plates must be otherwise of the 119 same material and size as standard license plates issued for any 120 registration period. In small letters, the word "Florida" must 121 appear at either the bottom or top of the plate, depending upon the design. In addition, A specialty license plate may bear an 122 appropriate slogan, emblem, or logo in a size and placement that 123 124 conforms to the department's design specifications.

125 (7) The department shall annually retain from the first proceeds derived from the annual use fees collected an amount 126 127 sufficient to defray each specialty plate's pro rata share of 128 the department's costs directly related to issuing the specialty 129 license plate program. Such costs shall include inventory costs, 130 distribution costs, direct costs to the department, costs associated with reviewing each organization's compliance with 131 132 the audit and attestation requirements of s. 320.08062, and any applicable increased costs of manufacturing the specialty 133 license plate. Any cost increase to the department related to 134

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135 actual cost of the plate, including a reasonable vendor profit, 136 shall be verified by the Department of Management Services. The 137 balance of the proceeds from the annual use fees collected for 138 that specialty license plate shall be distributed as provided by 139 law.

140 (8)(a) The department must discontinue the issuance of an 141 approved specialty license plate if <u>the number of valid</u> 142 <u>specialty plate registrations falls below 2,000 for at least 12</u> 143 <u>consecutive months. A warning letter shall be mailed to the</u> 144 <u>sponsoring organization following the first month in which the</u> 145 <u>total number of valid specialty plate registrations is below</u> 146 <u>2,000.</u>÷

147 1. Less than 8,000 plates, including annual renewals, are 148 issued for that specialty license plate by the end of the 5th 149 year of sales.

150 2. Less than 8,000 plates, including annual renewals, are 151 issued for that specialty license plate during any subsequent 5-152 year period.

153 The department is authorized to discontinue the (b) 154 issuance of a specialty license plate and distribution of 155 associated annual use fee proceeds if the organization no longer 156 exists, if the organization has stopped providing services that 157 are authorized to be funded from the annual use fee proceeds, or 158 pursuant to an organizational recipient's request. Organizations are required to notify the department immediately to stop all 159 warrants for plate sales if any of the conditions in this 160 section exist, and must meet the requirements of s. 320.08062 161 for any period of operation during a fiscal year. 162

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163 The requirements of paragraph (a) shall not apply to (C) 164 collegiate specialty license plates authorized in s. 320.08058(3), (13), (21), and (26). 165 166 Section 3. Subsection (1) of section 320.08062, Florida 167 Statutes, is amended to read: 168 320.08062 Audits and attestations required; annual use fees of specialty license plates .--169 170 (1)(a) All organizations and state agencies that receive 171 annual use fee proceeds from the department are responsible for 172 ensuring that proceeds are used in accordance with ss. 320.08056 173 and 320.08058 and shall annually attest, under penalties of 174 perjury, that such proceeds were used in compliance with ss. 175 320.08056 and 320.08058. The attestation shall be made annually in a form and format determined by the department and must 176 include, at a minimum, identification of all revenue received by 177 178 the organization or agency from sales of the specialty license 179 plate and a categorical list of expenditures. 180 (b) Any organization not subject to audit pursuant to s. 215.97 shall annually attest, under penalties of perjury, that 181 182 such proceeds were used in compliance with ss. 320.08056 and 320.08058. The attestation shall be made annually in a form and 183 184 format determined by the department. (b)(c) Any organization subject to audit pursuant to s. 185 186 215.97 shall submit an audit report in accordance with rules promulgated by the Auditor General in addition to the 187 attestation required under paragraph (a). The annual attestation 188 189 shall be submitted to the department for review within 9 months after the end of the organization's fiscal year. 190

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191	Section 4. The Department of Highway Safety and Motor								
192	Vehicles shall, in cooperation with representatives of the local								
193	tax collectors and with Prison Rehabilitative Industries and								
194	Diversified Enterprises, Inc., at Union Correctional Facility,								
195	study the operational and economic feasibility of direct-to-								
196	customer delivery of specialty license plates. The study shall								
197	include, but not be limited to, an analysis of the potential								
198	operational and economic impact of various manufacturing,								
199	inventory control, and product distribution technologies on the								
200	specialty license plate program. The department shall report its								
201	findings to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the								
202	House of Representatives no later than December 31, 2004.								
203	Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.								

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
