A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to motor vehicle insurance for foster children; creating a pilot program for 3 4 the purpose of reimbursing foster parents, residential facilities, or foster children who 5 live independently for a portion of the 6 increased costs of motor vehicle insurance for 7 a foster child who has a driver's license; 8 9 directing the Department of Children and Family Services to establish the pilot program in 10 Sarasota, DeSoto, Manatee, Pinellas, and Pasco 11 12 Counties; requiring that the person who incurs the increased cost submit to the department 13 documentation of that increase; requiring that 14 15 foster children be encouraged to pay the remaining portion of the increase in costs; 16 17 directing the department to develop procedures for operating the pilot program; requiring the 18 19 department to submit a report with 20 recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date; providing an 21 22 appropriation; providing an effective date. 23 24 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 25 26 Section 1. (1) The Legislature finds that the 27 increased cost of motor vehicle insurance for a foster child 28 after that child attains a driver's license is borne by the 29 foster parents and the authorized representative of the 30 residential facility. This increase in the cost of insurance

creates an additional barrier for a foster child in gaining

independence and may limit the child's opportunities for obtaining employment. In accordance with these findings, the 2 3 Legislature directs the Department of Children and Family Services to establish a 3-year pilot program in Sarasota, 4 5 Desoto, Manatee, Pinellas, and Pasco Counties to pay for the 6 cost of motor vehicle insurance for foster children who have 7 obtained a driver's license.

- (2) To the extent that funding is available, the pilot program shall provide funds to pay for a portion of the increase in the cost of motor vehicle insurance incurred by the foster parents, residential facilities, or the foster child if living independently. To be eligible for payment under the pilot program, the person incurring the cost must submit to the department appropriate documentation demonstrating the increase in the cost of insurance. The amount of the payment to be provided to the foster parent, residential facility, or foster child if living independently shall be one-half of the amount of the increase in the cost of motor vehicle insurance which is incurred as a result of adding the foster child to the policy or less than one-half if another source of funding to pay for the increase is available. The foster child must be encouraged to pay the other half of the increase in insurance costs.
- The department shall develop procedures for operating the pilot program, including, but not limited to, determining eligibility, providing the payment, ensuring that payment is limited solely to the additional costs of including the foster child in the insurance policy, and allocating available funds.
- The department shall examine and utilize, to the 31 extent possible, other available options for funding the cost

of the motor vehicle insurance increase, such as, but not 1 2 limited to, through the child's master trust fund, social 3 security income, child support payments, and other income 4 available to the child. 5 Beginning July 1, 2005, and continuing for the 6 duration of the pilot program, the department shall submit to 7 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 8 the House of Representatives an annual report on the success 9 and outcomes achieved by the pilot program, with a 10 recommendation as to whether the pilot program should be 11 continued, terminated, or expanded. 12 Section 2. The sum of \$50,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Children and Family 13 14 Services for the purpose of implementing this act during the 2004-2005 fiscal year. 15 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. 17 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 18 19 CS for SB 1058 20 Increases the counties that will participate in the pilot program to include Pinellas and Pasco counties. 21 22 Removes the requirement that a foster youth pay one-half of the increased costs of motor vehicle insurance. 23 Expands the settings in which youth in foster care may be placed that are eligible to receive assistance through the pilot program to include other residential settings, as well as youth in subsidized independent living. 24 25 26 Removes the requirement that if a foster child accumulates six or more points due to moving traffic violations, the child's foster parent is ineligible to receive the reimbursement under 27 the pilot program. 28 2.9 Directs the Department of Children and Families to examine and use, when available, other funding options. 30 Modifies the reporting requirement to the Governor and Legislature to provide for an annual report for the duration of the pilot program with the first report due July 1, 2005. 31
