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A reviser's bill to be entitled
 An act relating to the Florida Statutes; repealing ss.
 110.116(2), 197.1722, 215.555(16), 261.06(12),
 288.063(11), 338.2216(5), 372.60, 375.041(6), 401.113(4),
 403.1838(4), 403.7095(7), 409.1671(1)(m), 468.805,
 489.118(2)(b), 553.8412, and 1010.78(2), F.S., all of
 which provisions have become inoperative by noncurrent
 repeal or expiration and, pursuant to s. 11.242(5)(b) and
 (i), may be omitted from the Florida Statutes 2004 only
 through a reviser's bill duly enacted by the Legislature;
 and repealing s. 440.185(11), F.S., to confirm the October
 2, 2003, repeal of an exemption in accordance with the
 Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995; providing an
 effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 110.116, Florida
 Statutes, is repealed.

Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which relates
 to department authorization to contract with a vendor
 to provide the personnel information system for state
 agencies for the 2002-2003 fiscal year only, expired
 pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

Section 2. Section 197.1722, Florida Statutes, is
 repealed.

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30 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which relates to a
 31 waiver of certain mandatory charges relating to
 32 property taxes due for the 2001 tax year only, was
 33 repealed pursuant to its own terms, effective April 1,
 34 2003.

 36 Section 3. Subsection (16) of section 215.555, Florida
 37 Statutes, is repealed.

 39 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which relates
 40 to a specified percentage for certain funds
 41 disbursement for the 2002-2003 fiscal year only,
 42 expired pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1,
 43 2003.

 45 Section 4. Subsection (12) of section 261.06, Florida
 46 Statutes, is repealed.

 48 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which requires
 49 a review and report to determine the feasibility of
 50 providing public access for off-highway vehicle
 51 recreation and trails on public lands, expired
 52 pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

 54 Section 5. Subsection (11) of section 288.063, Florida
 55 Statutes, is repealed.

 57 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which relates
 58 to designation and funding of projects that the

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59 Legislature deems necessary to facilitate the economic
 60 development and growth of the state, expired pursuant
 61 to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

 63 Section 6. Subsection (5) of section 338.2216, Florida
 64 Statutes, is repealed.

 66 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which relates
 67 to turnpike toll collectors and laborers being
 68 temporarily continued in career service for the 2002-
 69 2003 fiscal year only, expired pursuant to its own
 70 terms, effective July 1, 2003.

 72 Section 7. Section 372.60, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

 74 Reviser's note.--The cited section, which relates to
 75 issuance of a replacement hunting or fishing license
 76 or permit, was repealed by s. 39, ch. 2002-46, Laws of
 77 Florida, effective July 1, 2003. Since the section was
 78 not repealed by a "current session" of the
 79 Legislature, it may be omitted from the 2004 Florida
 80 Statutes only through a reviser's bill duly enacted by
 81 the Legislature. See s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i).

 83 Section 8. Subsection (6) of section 375.041, Florida
 84 Statutes, is repealed.

85
 86 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which specifies
 87 that, for the 2002-2003 fiscal year only, use of funds

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88 allocated to the Land Acquisition Trust Fund shall be
 89 as provided in the General Appropriations Act, expired
 90 pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

 92 Section 9. Subsection (4) of section 401.113, Florida
 93 Statutes, is repealed.

94
 95 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which relates
 96 to use of moneys in the Emergency Medical Services
 97 Trust Fund, for the 2002-2003 fiscal year only, for
 98 the purpose of funding the rural hospital capital
 99 improvement grant program in accordance with s.
 100 395.6061, expired pursuant to its own terms, effective
 101 July 1, 2003.

 103 Section 10. Subsection (4) of section 403.1838, Florida
 104 Statutes, is repealed.

 106 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which
 107 authorizes the Department of Environmental Protection
 108 to waive a specified requirement in certain funding
 109 agreements, expired pursuant to its own terms,
 110 effective July 1, 2003.

 112 Section 11. Subsection (7) of section 403.7095, Florida
 113 Statutes, is repealed.

 115 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which provides
 116 that the Department of Environmental Protection shall

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117 provide solid waste management and recycling grants
 118 only to counties with populations under 100,000 for
 119 fiscal year 2002-2003 only, expired pursuant to its
 120 own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

122 Section 12. Paragraph (m) of subsection (1) of section
 123 409.1671, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

125 Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which provides
 126 that, for the 2002-2003 fiscal year only, the
 127 Department of Children and Family Services may combine
 128 the current community-based care lead agency contracts
 129 for Sarasota, Manatee, and DeSoto Counties into a
 130 single contract, expired pursuant to its own terms,
 131 effective July 1, 2003.

133 Section 13. Subsection (11) of section 440.185, Florida
 134 Statutes, is repealed.

136 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which relates
 137 to confidentiality of a report of injury or illness
 138 filed pursuant to s. 440.185 that would identify an
 139 ill or injured employee, is repealed to confirm the
 140 October 2, 2003, repeal of an exemption in accordance
 141 with s. 119.15, the Open Government Sunset Review Act
 142 of 1995.

144 Section 14. Section 468.805, Florida Statutes, is
 145 repealed.

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Reviser's note.--The cited section, which grandfathered certain persons practicing orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics for purposes of licensure provisions for a specified period of time, was repealed pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

Section 15. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 489.118, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

Reviser's note.--The cited paragraph, which relates to contractor certification requirements for disabled applicants in lieu of passing the written examination for fiscal year 2002-2003 only, expired pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

Section 16. Section 553.8412, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

Reviser's note.--The cited section, which provides for legislative intent, training, and related funding in relation to the Florida Building Code, was repealed by its own terms, effective June 30, 2003.

Section 17. Subsection (2) of section 1010.78, Florida Statutes, is repealed.

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174 Reviser's note.--The cited subsection, which provides
 175 for exemption from the requirements of s.
 176 216.262(1)(a) of personnel employed in relation to the
 177 Projects, Contracts, and Grants Trust Fund, expired
 178 pursuant to its own terms, effective July 1, 2003.

 180 Section 18. This act shall take effect on the 60th day
 181 after adjournment sine die of the session of the Legislature in
 182 which enacted.
