31-635-04 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to automated external defibrillators; amending s. 401.2915, F.S.; 3 4 revising legislative intent with respect to the 5 use of an automated external defibrillator; 6 classifying an automated external defibrillator 7 as a lifesaving device; defining a related term; providing an effective date. 8 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 11 12 Section 1. Section 401.2915, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 13 401.2915 Automated external defibrillators.--It is the 14 intent of the Legislature that an automated external 15 16 defibrillator may be used by any person for the purpose of 17 saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest. In order to achieve that goal, the Legislature intends to encourage 18 19 training in lifesaving first aid, set standards for the use of automated external defibrillators, and encourage their use. 20 21 (1) As used in this section, the term: 22 (a) "Automated external defibrillator" means a 23 lifesaving device that: 1. Is approved for premarket modification by the 24 25 United States Food and Drug Administration pursuant to 21 26 U.S.C. s. 360(k); 27 2. Is capable of recognizing the presence or absence 28 of ventricular fibrillation or rapid ventricular tachycardia 29 and is capable of determining, without intervention by an 30 operator, if defibrillation should be performed; and 31

Automatically charges and delivers an electrical impulse to a person's heart when it determines that 2 3 defibrillation should be performed. 4 (b) "Defibrillation" means the administration of a 5 controlled electrical charge to the heart to restore a viable б cardiac rhythm. 7 (2) In order to ensure public health and safety: 8 (a) (1) All persons who use an automated external 9 defibrillator must obtain appropriate training, to include 10 completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or 11 successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and 12 13 demonstrated proficiency in the use of an automated external defibrillator; 14 (b) (2) Any person or entity in possession of an 15 automated external defibrillator is encouraged to register 16 17 with the local emergency medical services medical director the existence and location of the automated external 18 19 defibrillator; and 20 (c) (c) (3) Any person who uses an automated external defibrillator shall is required to activate the emergency 21 22 medical services system as soon as possible upon use of the automated external defibrillator. 23 24 Section 2.
