Technical provisions to 33 34 be contained within the Florida Building Code are restricted to 35 requirements related to the types of materials used and 36 construction methods and standards employed in order to meet 37 criteria specified in the Florida Building Code. Provisions relating to the personnel, supervision or training of personnel, 38 39 or any other professional qualification requirements relating to 40 contractors or their workforce may not be included within the Florida Building Code, and subsections (4), (5), (6), and (7) 41 42 are not to be construed to allow the inclusion of such provisions within the Florida Building Code by amendment. This 43 restriction applies to both initial development and amendment of 44 45 the Florida Building Code.
