1 The Committee on Education K-20 recommends the following: 2 3 Committee Substitute 4 Remove the entire bill and insert: A bill to be entitled 5 6 An act relating to powers and duties of district school 7 boards; amending s. 1001.43, F.S.; authorizing district 8 school board programs and policies to require drug testing 9 of middle and high school students in certain 10 circumstances; prohibiting district school boards from 11 using instructional funds to pay for testing; prohibiting 12 district school boards from excluding students from extracurricular activities based on inability to pay for 13 testing; authorizing the State Board of Education to adopt 14 rules; providing an effective date. 15 16

WHEREAS, the State of Florida considers providing a qualityeducation to its children the highest of priorities, and

WHEREAS, participation in extracurricular activities is a key component of school life, is essential for students applying to college, and is a significant contributor to the breadth and quality of the educational experience for all participants, and

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CS 23 WHEREAS, extracurricular activities are an integral part of the educational process, providing personal challenges and 24 25 responsibility, skill in competition, teamwork cultivation, and 26 school pride, and WHEREAS, the State of Florida has a compelling interest in 27 28 ensuring that children are educated and compete in a safe and 29 healthy environment, and WHEREAS, the use of illicit drugs, performance enhancing 30 31 drugs, and certain prescription drugs is considered a health and 32 safety threat within Florida's schools, playgrounds, and 33 athletic fields and forums, and 34 WHEREAS, studies and pilot projects have found a 35 significant curtailment of drug use among students who are 36 subject to drug testing, NOW, THEREFORE, 37 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 38 39 Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 1001.43, Florida 40 41 Statutes, is amended to read: 42 Supplemental powers and duties of district school 1001.43 board.--The district school board may exercise the following 43 44 supplemental powers and duties as authorized by this code or State Board of Education rule. 45 46 (1)STUDENT MANAGEMENT. -- The district school board may 47 adopt programs and policies to ensure the safety and welfare of 48 individuals, the student body, and school personnel, which 49 programs and policies may:

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(a) Prohibit the possession of weapons and drugs on
campus, student hazing, and other activities that could threaten
the operation of the school or the safety and welfare of the
student body or school personnel.

54 (b) Require middle and high school students, as a 55 condition of participation in any extracurricular activity, to consent to urinalysis testing for the presence of any controlled 56 57 substance listed in s. 893.03. Funds provided by the state for student instruction shall not be used to pay for the testing 58 59 authorized by this paragraph. No student shall be prevented from 60 participating in any extracurricular activity because of inability to pay for such testing. The procedures for 61 62 implementing this paragraph shall be prescribed by rules of the State Board of Education pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54. 63

64 <u>(c)(b)</u> Require uniforms to be worn by the student body, or 65 impose other dress-related requirements, if the district school 66 board finds that those requirements are necessary for the safety 67 or welfare of the student body or school personnel.

68 (d)(c) Provide procedures for student dismissal 69 precautions and for granting permission for students to leave 70 school grounds during school hours, including releasing a 71 student from school upon request by a parent or for public 72 appearances of school groups.

73 (e)(d) Provide procedures for managing protests,
74 demonstrations, sit-ins, walk-outs, or other acts of civil
75 disobedience.

76 (f)(e) Provide procedures for detaining students and for
 77 readmission of students after expulsion.
