The program shall: (a) Establish and maintain an electronic communication 20 system capable of transmitting fire and emergency incident 21 information to and between fire protection agencies. 22 23 (b) Initiate a fire and emergency incident information 24 reporting system that shall be responsible for: 25 1. Receiving fire and emergency incident information from fire protection agencies. 26 27 2. Preparing and disseminating annual reports to the 28 Governor, the Legislature, fire protection agencies, and, upon 29 request, the public. Each report shall include, but need not 30 be limited to, the information listed in the National Fire

1 3. Upon request, providing other states and federal agencies with state fire and emergency incident data. 2 3 (c) Adopt rules to effectively and efficiently implement, administer, manage, maintain, and utilize the Fire 4 5 and Emergency Incident Information Program. The rules shall be 6 minimum requirements and do not preclude a fire protection 7 agency from implementing its own requirements that are not in 8 conflict with the rules of the Division of State Fire Marshal. 9 (d) By rule, establish procedures and a format for 10 each fire protection agency to voluntarily monitor its records 11 and submit reports to the program. (e) Establish an electronic information database that 12 is accessible and searchable by fire protection agencies. 13 14 The Division of State Fire Marshal shall consult with the 15 Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 16 17 Consumer Services and the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services of the Department of Health to coordinate data, ensure 18 19 accuracy of the data, and limit duplication of efforts in data 20 collection, analysis, and reporting.  - 3. One member from the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services, appointed by the bureau chief.
 - (3) As used in this section, the term "fire protection agency" shall be defined by rule by the Division of State Fire Marshal.
 - Section 2. Section 633.171, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
 - 633.171 Penalty for violation of law, rule, or order to cease and desist or for failure to comply with corrective order.--
 - (1) A person who violates The violation of any provision of this law, or any order or rule of the State Fire Marshal, or any order to cease and desist or to correct conditions issued under this chapter commits hereunder, shall constitute a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
 - (2) It \underline{is} shall constitute a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, to intentionally or willfully:
 - (a) Render a fire extinguisher or preengineered system required by statute or by rule inoperative except during such time as the extinguisher or preengineered system is being serviced, hydrotested, tested, repaired, or recharged, except pursuant to court order.
 - (b) Obliterate the serial number on a fire extinguisher for purposes of falsifying service records.
 - (c) Improperly service, recharge, repair, hydrotest, test, or inspect a fire extinguisher or preengineered system.

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- (d) Use the license or permit number of another person.
- (e) Hold a permit and allow another person to use the said permit number.
- (f) Use, or permit the use of, any license by any individual or organization other than the one to whom the license is issued.
- (3)(a) A person who initiates a pyrotechnic display in an indoor facility that does not have a fire protection system installed according to the Florida Fire Prevention Code and National Fire Protection Association Standard 13 commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (b) A person who initiates a pyrotechnic display in an indoor facility without the written consent of the owner or operator of the indoor facility and without a permit issued by the local authority having jurisdiction commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (c) This section does not apply to the manufacture, distribution, sale at wholesale or retail, or seasonal sale of products regulated under chapter 791 if the products are not used in an indoor facility.

Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 633.821, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (6) is added to that section, to read:

633.821 Workplace safety.--

(2) The division shall have the authority to adopt rules for the purpose of ensuring safe working conditions for all firefighter employees by authorizing the enforcement of 31 effective standards, by assisting and encouraging firefighter

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employers to maintain safe working conditions, and by 2 providing for education and training in the field of safety. 3 Specifically, the division may by rule adopt all or any part of subparts C through T and subpart Z of 29 C.F.R. s. 1910, as 4 5 revised April 8, 1998; the National Fire Protection 6 Association, Inc., Standard 1500, paragraph 5-7 (Personal Alert Safety System) (1992 edition); the latest edition of the 7 8 National Fire Protection Association Inc., Publication 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions, as limited by 9 10 subsection (6); and ANSI A 10.4-1990.

- (6)(a) The division shall adopt rules for live fire training that all firefighters subject to this chapter must complete. The division shall also adopt rules for a training and certification process for live-fire-training instructors.
 - (b) The rules for training shall include:
- 1. Sections of the most current edition of National
 Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1402, Guide to
 Building Fire Service Training Centers, relating to
 establishing policies and procedures for the effective use of
 permanent facilities or structures.
- <u>2. Sections of the most current edition of National</u>
 <u>Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1403, Standard</u>
 on Live Fire Training Evolutions, excluding, however:
 - a. Any chapter entitled "Referenced Publications";
- b. References to the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1975, Station Uniform;
- c. The National Fire Protection Association, Inc.,
 Publication 1001, or any reference to this publication in the
 National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1975;
 and

1	d. Any reference to authority having jurisdiction in
2	National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1403,
3	defined as the organization, office, or individual responsible
4	for approving equipment, materials, and installation, or
5	procedures.
6	3. A 40-hour training program for live-fire-training
7	instructors including:
8	a. Live fire instructional techniques;
9	b. Training safety in acquired or permanent facilities

11	c. Personnel safety; and
12	d. Exterior props, including, but not limited to,
13	liquid petroleum gas, other liquid fuels, and similar props.

22	training credentialed by the National Wildfire Coordinating
23	Group through the Florida Division of Forestry.
