Section 1. Section 288.833, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

(1) There is created the State Homeland Security Trust

within the Department of Community Affairs. Funds shall be credited to the trust fund as provided in s. 288.857(4)(c), to be used to fund state homeland security with priorities for funding to focus on costs not funded by the Federal Government, such as operational costs of security at seaports and other venues. Requests for funding shall be reviewed by the Domestic Security Oversight Board which shall provide recommended funding priorities.

- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 216.301 and pursuant to s. 216.351, any balance in the trust fund at the end of any fiscal year shall remain in the trust fund at the end of the year and shall be available for carrying out the purposes of the trust fund.
- (3) In accordance with s. 19(f)(2), Art. III of the State Constitution, the State Homeland Security Trust Fund shall be terminated on July 1, 2008, unless terminated sooner. Before its scheduled termination, the trust fund shall be reviewed as provided in s. 215.3206(1) and (2).
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004, if House Bill 1193 or similar legislation creating the Florida Commerce With Terrorist States Act is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
