Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) and subsection (5) of section 220.187, Florida Statutes, are 15 16 amended, present subsections (6), (7), and (8) of that section 17 are redesignated as subsections (7), (8), and (9), respectively, and a new subsection (6) is added to that 18 19 section, to read: 20 220.187 Credits for contributions to nonprofit 21 scholarship-funding organizations.--22 (2) DEFINITIONS.--As used in this section, the term: 23 "Eligible nonpublic school" means a nonpublic (C) school located in Florida that offers an education to students 24 25 in any grades K-12 and that meets the requirements in 26 subsection(7)(5). 27 (5) PARENT OBLIGATIONS.--As a condition for 28 scholarship payment pursuant to paragraph (4)(g), if the parent chooses for his or her child to attend an eligible 29 30 nonpublic school, the parent must inform the child's school 31 district within 15 days after such decision. student who participates in the tax credit scholarship program shall ensure that the student takes all statewide assessments required under s. 1008.22. (6) SCHOOL DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS. -- The school district shall provide locations and times for students in the school district who are participating in the tax credit scholarship program to take all statewide assessments required under s. 1008.22. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004. SENATE SUMMARY Requires the parent of a student who has received a scholarship from an eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization to ensure that the student takes all required statewide assessments. Requires school districts to provide locations and times for those students to take such assessments.
