Further, the Florida Building Code must provide for uniform implementation of ss. 515.25, 515.27, 4 5 and 515.29 by including standards and criteria for residential б swimming pool barriers, pool covers, latching devices, door 7 and window exit alarms, and other equipment required therein, 8 which are consistent with the intent of s. 515.23. Technical provisions to be contained within the Florida Building Code 9 10 are restricted to requirements related to the types of 11 materials used and construction methods and standards employed in order to meet criteria specified in the Florida Building 12 13 Code. Provisions relating to the personnel, supervision or 14 training of personnel, or any other professional qualification requirements relating to contractors or their workforce may 15 not be included within the Florida Building Code, and 16 17 subsections (4), (5), (6), and (7) are not to be construed to allow the inclusion of such provisions within the Florida 18 19 Building Code by amendment.
