The area proposed for addition to 29 the enterprise zone must include the three noncontiguous areas 30 designated as a federal empowerment zone under the 2000 Community Renewal Tax Relief Act without any limitations as to 31 9

If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 18 19 invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid 20 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of 21 22 this act are severable. 23 Section 13.
