11-1010A-04 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to military awards and decorations; authorizing the Governor to 3 4 present the Governor's Medal of Merit to a resident of this state who has rendered 5 exceptional meritorious service or who is 6 7 serving, or who has been honorably discharged from service, in the United States Armed 8 9 Forces, the Florida National Guard, or the United States Reserve Forces and, while on 10 11 active duty, rendered exceptional meritorious 12 service; providing a definition; providing for 13 the medal to be presented to a designated representative in the event of the death of a 14 chosen recipient; authorizing the Governor to 15 16 make rules for presenting and distributing the Governor's Medal of Merit; amending s. 250.10, 17 F.S.; authorizing the Adjutant General to issue 18 19 military decorations and awards; providing an effective date. 20 21 22 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 23 24 Section 1. Governor's Medal of Merit .--25 (1) The Governor may present, in the name of the State of Florida, a medal to be known as the "Governor's Medal of 26 27 Merit," which shall bear a suitable inscription and ribbon of 28 appropriate design, to: 29 (a) Any legal resident of this state who has rendered 30 exceptional meritorious service to the citizens of this state; 31

1 (b) Any legal resident of this state who is serving under honorable conditions on active duty as a member of the 2 3 United States Armed Forces, the Florida National Guard, or the United States Reserve Forces and has rendered exceptional 4 5 meritorious service to the citizens of this state while on б active duty; or 7 (c) Any legal resident of this state who has been 8 honorably discharged from active duty as a member of the United States Armed Forces, the Florida National Guard, or the 9 10 United States Reserve Forces and, while on active duty, 11 rendered exceptional meritorious service to the citizens of 12 this state. 13 As used in this subsection, the term "exceptional meritorious 14 service" means acts of bravery above and beyond the level of 15 duty normally required by that person's respective military or 16 17 civilian position. (2) In the event of the death of an individual who has 18 19 been chosen to receive the Governor's Medal of Merit, the medal shall be presented to a designated representative of the 20 21 chosen recipient. The Governor, in consultation with the Adjutant 22 (3) General and other appropriate entities, may make any rules 23 24 deemed necessary for the proper presentation and distribution of the Governor's Medal of Merit. The medal may be presented 25 to an individual one time only. 26 27 Section 2. Paragraph (n) is added to subsection (2) of section 250.10, Florida Statutes, to read: 28 29 250.10 Appointment and duties of the Adjutant 30 General.--31 (2) The Adjutant General shall: 2
