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A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to the Department of Transportation; amending s. 20.23, F.S.; 3 4 authorizing the secretary of the department to 5 appoint an additional assistant secretary and 6 deputy assistant secretaries or directors; 7 revising the organization of the department to specify areas of program responsibility; 8 9 authorizing the secretary to reorganize offices within the department in consultation with the 10 11 Executive Office of the Governor; amending s. 12 110.205, F.S., relating to career service; conforming provisions to changes made by the 13 act; providing an effective date. 14 15 16 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 17 Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (1), subsection 18 19 (3), and paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 20.23, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 20 21 20.23 Department of Transportation.--There is created 22 a Department of Transportation which shall be a decentralized 23 agency. 24 (1)25 (d) The secretary may shall appoint up to three two assistant secretaries who shall be directly responsible to the 26 27 secretary and who shall perform such duties as are assigned by 28 the secretary. The secretary may delegate to any assistant secretary the authority to act in the absence of the 29 30 secretary.

- (3)(a) The central office shall establish departmental policies, rules, procedures, and standards and shall monitor the implementation of such policies, rules, procedures, and standards in order to ensure uniform compliance and quality performance by the districts and central office units that implement transportation programs. Major transportation policy initiatives or revisions shall be submitted to the commission for review.
- (b) The secretary shall appoint an Assistant Secretary for Transportation Development and Operations and an Assistant Secretary for Transportation Support.
- (b)(c) The secretary may appoint positions at the level of deputy assistant secretary or director which the secretary deems necessary to accomplish the mission and goals of the department, including, but not limited to, the areas of program responsibility provided in this paragraph following offices are established and shall be headed by a manager, each of whom shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the secretary. The secretary may combine, separate, or delete offices as needed in consultation with the Executive Office of the Governor. The department's areas of program responsibility include, but are not limited to positions shall be classified at a level equal to a division director:
  - 1. The Office of Administration;
  - 2. The Office of Planning and Environmental

- 3. The Office of Design;
- 4. The Office of Highway operations;
- 5. The Office of Right-of-way;
  - 6. The Office of Toll operations;
  - 7. The Office of Information systems;

1 The Office of Motor carrier compliance; 2 9. The Office of Management and budget; 3 10. The Office of Comptroller; 11. The Office of Construction; 4 The Office of Maintenance; and 5 12. 6 13. The Office of Materials. 7 (c)<del>(d)</del> Other offices may be established in accordance 8 with s. 20.04(7). The heads of such offices are exempt from part II of chapter 110. No office or organization shall be 9 10 created at a level equal to or higher than a division without 11 specific legislative authority. (d)<del>(e)</del> The secretary shall appoint an inspector 12 general pursuant to s. 20.055 who shall be directly 13 responsible to the secretary and shall serve at the pleasure 14 15 of the secretary. (e) (f) The secretary shall appoint a general counsel 16 17 who shall be directly responsible to the secretary. The 18 general counsel is responsible for all legal matters of the 19 department. The department may employ as many attorneys as it 20 deems necessary to advise and represent the department in all 21 transportation matters. 22 (g) The secretary shall appoint a state transportation development administrator. This position shall be classified 23 24 at a level equal to a deputy assistant secretary. 25 (h) The secretary shall appoint a state transportation operations administrator. This position shall be classified at 26 27 a level equal to a deputy assistant secretary. 28 (i) The secretary shall appoint a state public 29 transportation and modal administrator. This position shall be 30 classified at a level equal to a deputy assistant secretary. 31 (4)

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(b) Each district secretary may appoint up to three  $\frac{1}{2}$ district directors director for transportation development, a district director for transportation operations, and a district director for transportation support or, until July 1, 2005, each district secretary may appoint up to four a district directors director for planning and programming, a district director for production, a district director for operations, and a district director for administration. These positions are exempt from part II of chapter 110.

Section 2. Paragraphs (j) and (m) of subsection (2) of section 110.205, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

110.205 Career service; exemptions.--

- (2) EXEMPT POSITIONS. -- The exempt positions that are not covered by this part include the following:
- The appointed secretaries, assistant secretaries, deputy secretaries, and deputy assistant secretaries of all departments; the executive directors, assistant executive directors, deputy executive directors, and deputy assistant executive directors of all departments; the directors of all divisions and those positions determined by the department to have managerial responsibilities comparable to such positions, which positions include, but are not limited to, program directors, assistant program directors, district administrators, deputy district administrators, the Director of Central Operations Services of the Department of Children and Family Services, the State Transportation Development Administrator, State Public Transportation and Modal Administrator, district secretaries, district directors of transportation development, transportation operations, transportation support, and the managers of the offices 31 specified in s. 20.23(3)(b)s. 20.23(3)(c), of the Department

of Transportation. Unless otherwise fixed by law, the department shall set the salary and benefits of these positions in accordance with the rules of the Senior Management Service; and the county health department directors and county health department administrators of the Department of Health.

- (m) All assistant division director, deputy division director, and bureau chief positions in any department, and those positions determined by the department to have managerial responsibilities comparable to such positions, which positions include, but are not limited to:
- 1. Positions in the Department of Health and the Department of Children and Family Services that are assigned primary duties of serving as the superintendent or assistant superintendent of an institution.
- 2. Positions in the Department of Corrections that are assigned primary duties of serving as the warden, assistant warden, colonel, or major of an institution or that are assigned primary duties of serving as the circuit administrator or deputy circuit administrator.
- 3. Positions in the Department of Transportation that are assigned primary duties of serving as regional toll managers and managers of offices as defined in  $\underline{s.\ 20.23(3)(b)}$   $\underline{s.\ 20.23(3)(c)}$  and  $\underline{(4)(d)}$ , and captains and majors of the Office of Motor Carrier Compliance.
- 4. Positions in the Department of Environmental Protection that are assigned the duty of an Environmental Administrator or program administrator.
- 5. Positions in the Department of Health that are assigned the duties of Environmental Administrator, Assistant

County Health Department Director, and County Health Department Financial Administrator. Unless otherwise fixed by law, the department shall set the salary and benefits of the positions listed in this paragraph in accordance with the rules established for the Selected Exempt Service. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* SENATE SUMMARY Authorizes the Secretary of Transportation to appoint an additional assistant secretary and deputy assistant secretaries or directors. Provides the areas of program responsibility for the department. Authorizes the secretary to reorganize offices within the department in consultation with the Executive Office of the Governor.
