The board shall prescribe by rule a fee not to exceed 25 \$50 for the reactivation of an inactive license and a fee not to exceed \$50 for the renewal of an inactive license. 26 27 (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 455.271, the 28 board shall reinstate and the department shall reissue by July 29 1, 2005, the license of an individual whose license has become null, provided all of the following circumstances and 30 31 qualifications are met: (a) The individual's license was scheduled to be renewed 32 33 during the biennium period beginning in 2001. 34 (b) The individual did not receive actual timely license 35 renewal notice, as attested to by a signed and notarized 36 affidavit of the individual. 37 The license of the individual was in good standing at (C) 38 the time of the beginning of the renewal cycle. 39 (d) The individual properly petitioned the department for relief relating to the circumstances under which the license 40 41 became null. 42 (e) The department failed to grant or deny the license 43 renewal petition within 90 days after receiving the petition, as 44 required by the Administrative Procedure Act and s. 120.542. 45 (f) No felony or practice act or unlicensed activity 46 penalties have been imposed upon the individual for violations 47 occurring during the period the license was null. 48 49 The individual shall submit an application to the board for 50 reinstatement in a manner prescribed by rules of the board and 51 shall pay the appropriate application fees in an amount equal to
