1 A bill to be entitled

An act relating to land surveying and mapping; amending s. 472.019, F.S.; authorizing and providing conditions, including fees, for the reinstatement and reissuance of licenses for certain individuals whose licenses became null under specified circumstances; providing for future repeal; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 472.019, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

472.019 Reactivation; continuing education; reinstatement.--

- (1) The continuing education requirements for reactivating a license may not exceed 12 classroom hours for each year the license was inactive.
- (2) The board shall promulgate rules relating to licenses which have become inactive and for the renewal of inactive licenses. The board shall prescribe by rule a fee not to exceed \$50 for the reactivation of an inactive license and a fee not to exceed \$50 for the renewal of an inactive license.
 - (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 455.271, the board shall reinstate and the department shall reissue by July 1, 2005, the license of an individual whose license has become null, provided all of the following circumstances and qualifications are met:

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(a) The individual's license was scheduled to be renewed during the biennium period beginning in 2001.

- (b) The individual did not receive actual timely license renewal notice, as attested to by a signed and notarized affidavit of the individual.
- (c) The license of the individual was in good standing at the time of the beginning of the renewal cycle.
- (d) The individual properly petitioned the department for relief relating to the circumstances under which the license became null.
- (e) The department failed to grant or deny the license renewal petition within 90 days after receiving the petition, as required by the Administrative Procedure Act and s. 120.542.
- (f) No felony or practice act or unlicensed activity penalties have been imposed upon the individual for violations occurring during the period the license was null.

The individual shall submit an application to the board for reinstatement in a manner prescribed by rules of the board and shall pay the appropriate application fees in an amount equal to the fees imposed for current applicants for new licensure. This subsection expires July 1, 2005.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
