The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of active or former law 23 enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional 24 25 probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of 26 27 abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal 28 activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties 29 are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, 30 and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local

and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from the provisions of subsection (1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such firefighters are exempt from subsection (1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of justices and judges are exempt from the provisions of subsection (1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide 31 prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt

- The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 2. security numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any local government agency or water management district whose duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former code enforcement officers; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such persons are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved 31 | from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

4.a. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of spouses and children of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by children of current or former personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office are exempt from subsection (1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. For purposes of this sub-subparagraph, personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office are defined as personnel whose primary duties or responsibilities include performing laboratory and analytical work in criminal identification and investigation; photographing crime scenes; classifying, evaluating, and identifying fingerprints; or supervising one or more persons who have those duties or responsibilities.

b. Sub-subparagraph a. is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

5.4. An agency that is the custodian of the personal information specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., or subparagraph 3., or subparagraph 4.and that is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in subparagraph 1., subparagraph 2., or subparagraph 3., or subparagraph 4.shall maintain the confidentiality of the personal information only if the 31 officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing

agency of the designated employee submits a written request 2 for confidentiality to the custodial agency. 3 Section 2. The Legislature finds that the exemption from public-records requirements provided by this act for 4 5 identifying information relating to current and former 6 personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office 7 and their families is a public necessity. This act is 8 justified because, if such information were not confidential, 9 personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office 10 or their family members could be harmed or threatened with harm by a criminal defendant or by a friend or family member 11 12 of a criminal defendant. 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2004. 14 15 16 SENATE SUMMARY Provides that personnel identifying information contained in records for personnel of a crime laboratory or medical examiner's office and their spouses and children are exempt from disclosure under the public records law.
