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An act relating to district school boards; creating s. 1001.3715, F.S.; providing a procedure for election of a district school board chair by countywide vote in a school district with single-member representation and an appointed district school superintendent; providing requirements for submission of the proposition to electors of the school district; providing for election of a district school board vice chair by the district school board; creating s. 1001.3717, F.S.; providing powers and duties, terms of office, and salary of a district school board chair elected by countywide vote; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1001.3715, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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1001.3715 Alternate procedure for election of district school board chair in school district with single-member representation and an appointed superintendent; election of vice chair.--

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(1) The district school board chair shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of s. 1001.371 unless, in a school district with single-member representation, pursuant to s. 1001.362, in which the office of district school superintendent is appointive pursuant to s. 1001.461, a proposition calling for the district school board chair to be elected by countywide vote is submitted to and approved by a

31 the manner provided in subsection (2).

(2) A proposition calling for the district school board chair to be elected by countywide vote shall be submitted to the electors of the school district at any primary, general, or otherwise-called special election in either manner following:

- (a) The district school board may adopt a formal resolution directing an election to be held to place the proposition on the ballot; or
- (b) The electors of the school district may petition to have the proposition placed on the ballot by presenting to the district school board petitions signed by not less than 10 percent of the duly qualified electors residing within the school district. The number of signatures required shall be determined by the supervisor of elections according to the number of registered electors in the school district as of the date the petitioning electors register as a political committee as provided in subsection (3).
- (3) The electors petitioning to have the proposition placed on the ballot shall register as a political committee pursuant to s. 106.03, and a specific person shall be designated therein as chair of the committee to act for the committee.
- (4) Each petition form circulated shall include the wording: "As a registered elector of the school district of _____ County, Florida, I am petitioning for a referendum election to determine whether the district school board chair shall be elected by countywide vote." The petition shall also include space for the signature and address of the elector. Each

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signature obtained shall be dated when made and is valid for a period of 4 years following that date.

- (5) Upon the filing of the petitions with the district school board by the chair of the committee, the district school board shall submit the petitions to the supervisor of elections for verification of the signatures. Within a period of not more than 30 days, the supervisor of elections shall determine whether the petitions contain the required number of valid signatures. The supervisor of elections shall be paid by the committee seeking verification the sum of 10 cents for each name checked.
- (6) If it is determined that the petitions have the required signatures, the supervisor of elections shall certify the petitions to the district school board, which shall adopt a resolution requesting that an election date be set to conform to the earliest primary, general, or otherwise-called special election that occurs not less than 30 days after certification of the petitions. If it is determined that the petitions do not contain the required signatures, the supervisor of elections shall so notify the district school board, which shall file the petitions without taking further action, and the matter shall be at an end. No additional names may be added to the petitions, and the petitions may not be used in any other proceeding.
- (7) No special election may be called for the sole purpose of presenting the proposition to the vote of the electors.
- (8) A district school board may increase its membership by one member through redistricting either simultaneously with, or at any time after, the implementation of the elected district school board chair governance option pursuant to this section.

- (k) Prepare and propose purchases of goods, services, and realty for district school board consideration.
- (1) Oversee the management of all district school board property and records.
- (m) Oversee the enforcement of policies of the district school board.
- (n) Call the district school board into regular and special session.
- (o) Serve as the official representative and ceremonial dignitary for the district school board, with the prerogative to issue proclamations.
- (p) Annually present a "state of the schools" message setting forth programs and improvements to be recommended to the district school board.
- (q) Execute all contracts and other legal documents, with the power to delegate such authority to execute.
- (r) Carry out all other duties and responsibilities prescribed by law or assigned by the district school board.
 - (s) Take all other actions that are executive in nature.
- (2) A district school board chair elected by countywide vote pursuant to s. 1001.3715 shall be limited to the extent other district school board members are term limited.
- (3) The salary of a district school board chair elected by countywide vote pursuant to s. 1001.3715 shall be set by district school board resolution, but shall not be less than the lowest salary and not more than the highest salary being paid to
