HB 1479 2004 A bill to be entitled

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An act relating to construction practices; providing legislative findings and intent; requiring the Florida Building Commission to review construction practices and building inspections in this state and to make recommendations for the improvement of those practices and inspections; providing procedures for the review; requiring the commission to report to the Governor and legislative leaders; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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## Florida Building Commission review of Section 1. construction practices and inspections .--

- (1) LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. -- The Legislature finds that due to the rapidly increasing rate of construction which has occurred in the first few years of the 21st century, the possibility exists for an increase in the prevalence of construction flaws and for a decrease in the quality of building and home inspections. The intent of the Legislature is that the review initiated under this act will produce findings that will increase the quality of construction and optimize the effectiveness of building and home inspections, while providing protection for builders, inspectors, and consumers.
- (2) REVIEW PROCEDURES. -- Beginning July 1, 2004, the Florida Building Commission shall conduct a review of current construction practices in this state for the purpose of formulating recommendations concerning how to improve the quality of construction in the state and how to maximize the

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effectiveness of the building inspections and home inspections
associated with such construction. The commission shall conduct
or contract for research that supports this purpose and shall
conduct hearings and any other activities that the commission
considers essential in fulfilling this purpose.

(3) REPORT.--By January 15, 2005, the Florida Building
Commission shall write a report of its findings under this
section and shall submit copies of the report to the Governor,
the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
Representatives. The report must include any recommendations for
proposed legislation that the commission considers appropriate

and necessary.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
