28-1044-04 See HM 193 1 Senate Memorial No. ____ 2 A memorial to the United States Army Corps of 3 Engineers, urging prompt action to complete the 4 Indian River Lagoon Restoration Plan on 5 schedule. 6 7 WHEREAS, the Indian River Lagoon is the most biologically diverse estuary in North America and is 8 9 recognized for national significance in the National Estuary 10 Program, and WHEREAS, the St. Lucie Estuary and Indian River Lagoon 11 12 have been and continue to be severely degraded by excessive freshwater discharges, nutrients, and sediments from drainage 13 canals constructed by the Central and Southern Florida Flood 14 Control Project, and 15 WHEREAS, the State of Florida has a long history of 16 17 supporting local, state, and federal programs to improve the environmental health of the St. Lucie Estuary and Indian River 18 19 Lagoon, which health is critical to the economic and social environment of Florida and the nation, and 20 21 WHEREAS, state support includes forming and funding the 22 St. Lucie River Issues Team, the Indian River Lagoon Restoration Task Force, and 50 percent of the costs of related 23 Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan projects, and 24 25 WHEREAS, local government partners, including the Nine County Coalition for the Responsible Management of Lake 26 27 Okeechobee and St. Lucie and Caloosahatchee Estuaries, are 28 implementing urban stormwater quality retrofit projects, budgeted at over \$100 million, dedicated to cleaning up the 29 30 St. Lucie Estuary and Indian River Lagoon, and 31 1
