Section 11.801, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 14 15 11.801 Legislative Historic Preservation Commission 16 created; powers and duties .--17 (1) There is created the Legislative Historic 18 Preservation Commission within the legislative branch of 19 government. 20 (2)(a) The commission shall consist of not more than 25 members, including: 21 22 1. Eight persons who are former members of the House 23 of Representatives, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. 24 25 2. Eight persons who are former members of the Senate, to be appointed by the President of the Senate. 26 27 3. The Clerk of the House of Representatives, the 28 Secretary of the Senate, and the Sergeant at Arms of each house. 29 30 4. The President of Tallahassee Community College, or his or her designee.

1 The Secretary of State, or his or her designee. The director of the commission. 2 3 Up to two other persons selected by the commission. The persons appointed under subparagraphs (a)1. 4 (b) 5 and 2. shall be appointed to serve staggered terms of 4 years. 6 Of the initial appointees, two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and two persons 7 8 appointed by the President of the Senate shall be appointed to serve terms of 4 years, two persons appointed by the Speaker 9 and two persons appointed by the President shall be appointed 10 11 to serve terms of 3 years, two persons appointed by the Speaker and two persons appointed by the President shall be 12 appointed to serve terms of 2 years, and the remaining 13 appointees shall be appointed to serve terms of 1 year, as 14 determined by the appointing presiding officer. In making the 15 initial appointments, each presiding officer must reappoint 16 17 any current or former member of the house over which the presiding officer presides; however, if more than six such 18 19 persons are presently serving on the commission, the presiding officer need reappoint only six of such persons. The terms of 20 the initial appointees shall begin July 1, 2004. 21 The commission shall elect from among its members 22 a chair and vice chair and such other officers as it desires. 23 24 The commission shall adopt its own rules of procedure, except 25 that with respect to the provisions of s. 24, Art. I of the State Constitution, the commission shall abide by the rules of 26 27 both houses regarding the enforcement of the section. The rules of procedure must provide that the meetings of the 28 29 commission will be open and that the public will be given 30 notice of the meetings.

- (4) The commission shall employ a director who must be appointed by the commission with the advice and consent of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives and shall serve at the pleasure of those legislative officers.
- (5) Members of the commission shall receive no compensation for their service on the commission but may be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses pursuant to s. 112.061.
- The commission shall meet at the call of the chair at least twice annually.
  - The duties of the commission shall include: (7)
- (a) Serving the Legislature with respect to the collection and preservation of the historic records of both houses of the Legislature. The commission shall provide a plan for the collection of historical information that is written, oral, anecdotal, or in the nature of artifacts.
- Providing for the availability of the historical information identified by the commission by the most appropriate means available, including by electronic transmission. The commission may also use any means available to entities created under chapters 257 and 267.
- (c) Overseeing and maintaining the operation of the Legislative Research Center and Museum located on the campus of Tallahassee Community College in Tallahassee.
- Overseeing, collecting, and expending funds allocated by the Legislature and any other funds received from other sources.
- (e) Performing such other duties as the commission considers necessary to the historic preservation of the records of the Legislature. 31

1	(8) In addition to other powers granted under this
2	section, the commission may:
3	(a) Make and enter into such contracts and agreements
4	as it determines are necessary, expedient, or incidental to
5	the performance of its duties.
6	(b) Accept gifts, grants, bequests, loans, and
7	endowments for purposes not inconsistent with its
8	responsibilities under this section.
9	(9) This section does not eliminate the duties of the
10	Department of State under s. 15.07.
11	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
